- O New Business: Ms. Turner brought up a few questions/request and not all was on the agenda and will be added to the following meeting agenda:
  - 1. Coes Pond Beach Grant Mr. Antonelli explained that the Commonwealth awarded \$400,000.00 towards Coes beach, the project went out to bid and was already awarded. Construction is set to start within a couple of weeks with a completion date of June 1, 2022.
  - 2. Coes Knife Mr. Antonelli stated this project is a canoe, kayak launch, handicap parking, a small pavilion/shelter and a place to store conoes and kayaks the intention is to have a place to rent canoes and kayaks only and it will be ADA accessible with a transfer station.
  - 3. Fence between Lakeside and Coes Park she wanted to know if the Parks Department put up the fence or if Worcester Housing Authority (WHA) put it up. Mr. Antonelli explained that WHA put it up and the City has no management control over that. WHA is willing to open the gate for the city while construction is going on and during daylight hours and closing back up at night. Ms. Turner stated that she would like something else different done with the fence situation whether the city has a conversation with WHA to see if it's something the city can acquire to have access to the public park because there is at least a mile walk to get access to the park.
  - 4. Beaver Brook parking towards Big Y, Ms. Turner stated that since Merrifield Street was closed there is no parking on that side and people are double parking on the Big Y parking lot because and it's become a dangerous situation, she has seen kids almost get hit by cars, almost get run off on their bikes, and car accidents and she would like something to be done about this. This will be added to the next agenda for discussion.
- O Motion to adjourn was made by Ms. Dube. Second by Mr. Lee. All were in favor. Motion was approved 6-0. Meeting was adjourned at 7:18 PM.
