## Worcester Public Schools Enrollment Report

Attached is the district's October 1, 2016 Enrollment Report. Some of the highlights include:

- Overall enrollment increased by 432 students, or 1.7%, from 24,959 last year to 25,391 this year.
  - High Schools had an overall increase of 207 students or 2.9%
  - Middle Schools had an overall increase of 82 students or 2.6%
  - Elementary Schools had an overall increase of 143 students or 1.0%
- Enrollment exceeds 25,000 for the first time since 2003. This is the 6<sup>th</sup> highest enrollment level in the past 27 years.
- The five schools with the largest percentage increase in enrollment were:
  - Burncoat Street Preparatory +15.0% (34 students)
  - Grafton Street School +10.4% (38 students)
  - Lincoln Street School +10.3% (27 students)
  - Elm Park Community School +7.9% (37 students)
  - Union Hill School +7.8% (38 students)
- The five schools with the largest percentage decrease in enrollment were:
  - Clark Street -19.0% (-47 students)
  - Heard Street School -10.1% (-30 students)
  - Gates Lane -7.3% (-47 students)
  - Belmont Street -5.3% (-31 students)
  - Chandler Magnet -3.9% (-19 students)
- The following grades had enrollment increases from the prior year:  
Pre-K (35), K (34) Grade 3 (101), Grade 5 (131), Grade 6 (78), Grade 7 (48), Grade 8 (23), Grade 9 (43), Grade 11 (195), and Grade 12 (16).
- The following grades had enrollment decreases from the prior year:  
Grade 1 (-102), Grade 2 (-22), Grade 4 (-115), Grade 10 (-33).

### Foundation Budget Analysis

- Inflation index is expected to be 1.11% (\$3.7 million increase)
- Economically Disadvantaged enrollment has increased 543 students (\$3.0 million increase)
- Overall enrollment increase (approximately \$2.2 million increase) offset by 762 fewer students categorized as English language learners (-\$1.7 million net reduction).
- Total foundation budget increase \$7.2 million (2.2%)

### High School Summary

- Doherty High's enrollment of 1,534 is the district's largest school and is the school's highest enrollment since 2006 (1,560).
- South High's enrollment of 1,396 is at its highest level since 2007 (1,402).
- Claremont Academy's enrollment of 536 is its highest level and has grown 58% (from 339 students) since separating from the ALL School into Woodland and Claremont Academies in 2005.
- High School enrollment of 7,398 is at its highest level since 2005 (7,445).

### Middle School Summary

- Forest Grove Middle School's enrollment of 1,000 students is the school's highest level and most students at one middle school since 2004 (Sullivan Middle 1,032 students).
- Worcester East Middle enrollment of 813 is its highest level since 2003 (816)

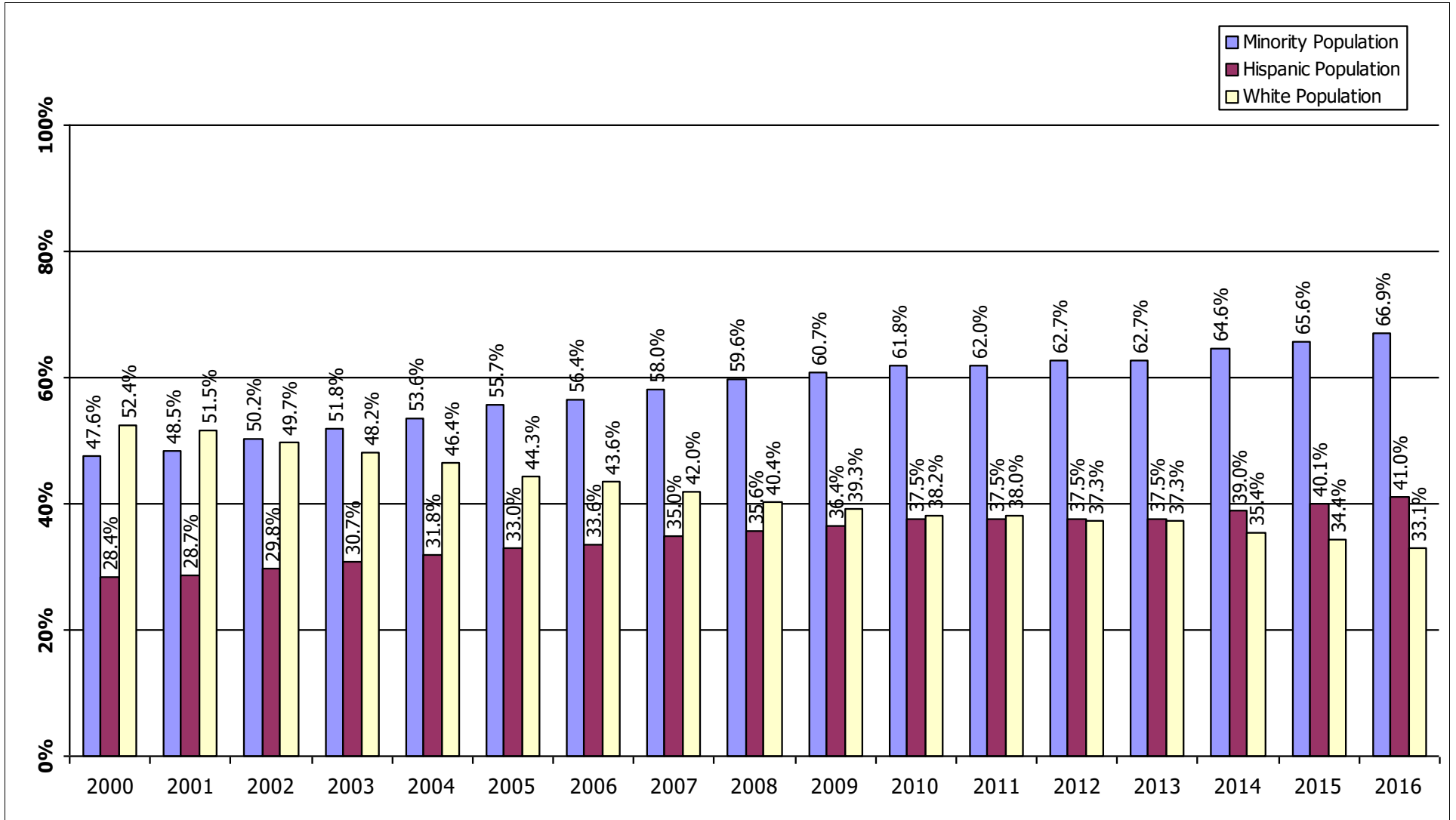
