Upon a motion the Commission voted 3-0 to approve the entertainment license.

Lodging House License Request

12. Petition: Request for lodging house license

David Batbouta from DE Realty appeared on behalf of the item. He stated that they have done upgrades to the building and have put outdoor lights in and have capability to have a camera system on the building and currently there are WPI graduate students living there and that is the plan of who to rent to in the future and they avoided making a three family as then they have no control over the building then and there are other WPI rooming houses in the area.

Chair Shea asked if the rooms would be rented out during the summer when students aren't there. Mr. Batbouta stated no.

Paul Moynihan from WPI stated that they would be renting to WPI students.

Attorney Finkelstein representing abutter Larry Quinn stated that the Special Permit from the Zoning Board of Appeals is under appeal and this is a single family neighborhood and Mr. Quinn has already had problems with the other lodging houses in the area and no one going to leave rooms un-rented during the summer months and this is not a sorority or a fraternity it just a lodging house and this is single family area so he would ask that the matter be held until it resolved in Superior Court and it premature to issue a license with the Special Permit under appeal.

Commissioner Salvidio stated that he saw no reason at this point to hold the item.

Larry Quinn abutter to the property stated the owner is not renting to people just for the school year as it not the case today.

Mr. Batbouta stated that they rent to the students on an annual basis and they are not there in the summer and can bring the students in if the Commission would like.

Commissioner Salvidio stated that is item is not germane and the applicant can rent the rooms or not and he understands Mr. Quinn concerns but they cannot limit to students as that would violate Fair Housing Law but the Commission would not take kindly if the housing was not kept up.

Chair Shea stated that his office is right down the street and they have done good job renovating it.

Commissioner Salvidio asked if the rooms were rented month to month. Mr. Batbouta stated no.

Commissioner Salvidio asked if manager would be on premises. Mr. Batbouta stated yes.

Mr. Quinn stated that he would like to be made aware of the name of the manager and their location in the house.

Commissioner Salvidio stated that would be a matter of public record.

Upon a motion the Commission voted 3-0 to approve the lodging house with the conditions set by the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Status Hearing

13. GHB Restaurant Inc., dba Freshway Pizza, 96A Water Street

Yehya Lazem, Renee Russo and Sam Sali appeared on behalf of the item.

The Worcester Police Department presented the following: From March 1, 2015 to march 26, 2016, there were 33 fight calls to the Worcester Police Department for 96A Water Street.

Sgt. Roche from the Worcester Police Department stated that the crowds from Freshway Pizza hang out/congregate on the sidewalk and in front of the establishment, often spilling out in the streets and presented a video of a large crowd that typically is outside the premises on a Friday night.

The Commission found that the violations mentioned in the police report occurred and that the owner is operating his business in an improper manner by creating a public safety situation. The business is not being conducted consistently with public health and safety. Moreover, the business is being conducted in a manner so as to allow illegal acts to occur on and in Freshway Pizza.

The Commission discussed whether it would be advisable to cut back on the hours at the establishment.

Lt. Johnson suggested that a 1:00 a.m. closing time would be better as would allow more time for the police officers to clear the area once the bars closed.

Upon a motion, the Commission voted 3-0, finding that the owner is conducting the business in an improper manner, inconsistent with the public health and safety, and in a manner so as to allow illegal acts to occur at the Licensed Premises.

Upon a motion, the Commission voted 3-0 to impose a temporary condition on the license for six (6) months, restricting the hours of operation and imposing a closing time at 1:00 a.m. on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, including no delivery past 1:00 a.m.
