ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER'S REPORT:

Chairperson Mr. Lauring called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM.

- Mr. Lauring went on to the acceptance of the minutes September 5, 2019.
 - Mrs. Dube made a motion to accept minutes, Mr. Chacharone second the motion. All were in favor. Motion was approved 7-0.
- Mr. Lauring turned the meeting over to Mr. Tomaino for the Assistant Commissioners report:
- Mr. Tomaino went on to the first item on the Assistant Commissioners report:
 - o Request of Conor Synan to perform an Eagle Scout Project on the East West Trail
 - Working with Park Sprit to add trail and mile markers to the East/ West Trail for his Eagle Scout Project. Informational kiosks that are 4x4 made from plywood. Plans on using the Robotics and animation shop at Worcester Technical High School to fabricate brackets and install solar panel lights that turn on at night and charge during the day.
 - Mr. Goldstein asked how many were being installed there will be 5 and a mile marker.
 - Mr. Cashman asked if there is signage there or if this is a first. There are a few installed.
 - Mr. Goldstein asked if the signage will be uniformed Mr. Tomaino said yes.
 - Mr. Chacharone made a motion to approve. Mr. Cashman second the motion. All were in favor. Motion was approved 7-0.
 - Update on Mosquito Control and Field availability
 - Mr. Tomaino said that we are following the recommendation of the Board of Health with not having our field's lights on and not giving out permits after a certain time until further notice when the first hard frost happens.
 - Mr. Cashman asked if this has been a burden to us
 - Mr. Tomaino responded no and that people understand.

- o Mr. Lee asked if Worcester is at critical risk.
- o Request to install a flag pole and storage container in Reed Field @ the Knights of Columbus Park
 - Jamie from Worcester Rugby club is looking to donate a flag pole at Reed Field. The dimensions of the flag pole is 20 feet and will have inlay ropes so it makes it harder for people to vandalize. The flag pole is for a memorial to a club member who passed.
 - Mr. Lauring asked what size flag fits on a 20' pole and Jamie responded a standard maybe a 5x5 or 5x10 size flag. Mr. Goldstein asked if the donation was the flag and the pole.
 - Jamie replied yes.
 - Mr. Lauring asked if Parks had any issues
 - Mr. Tomaino responded that Mr. Antonelli reviewed the location and was okay with it. He added that when they purchase the pile they would like to review it and make sure it goes in the ground properly.
 - Mr. Chacharone asked if Parks was putting in the pole or the company they are buying the pole from.
 - Jamie responded that the company they are buying from will also install it. A club member's father owns a flag pole company so they will do the work.
 - Mr. Lee asked if there will be any signage for the memorial.
 - Jamie said not at this time maybe at a later date.
 - Mr. Goldstein asked about the container piece.
 - Jamie said the container is 20x10 ft. and it will be back behind the flag pole but won't happen until late spring or summer of 2020.
 - Ms. Lamacchia asked how it would be locked
 - Jamie said it was going to be padlocked.
 - Mr. Goldstein motioned to approve, Mrs. Dube second the motion. All were in favor.
