Project #608169 - Switch funding of DUDLEY – SIGN AND PAVEMENT MARKING INSTALLATION & UPGRADES AND RELATED WORK ON DRESSER HILL ROAD (ROUTE 31), FROM STATE LINE TO TOWN LINE. The funding will be switched to Statewide HSIP instead of Statewide HSIPR.

• *Potential Action:* Approval of FY16 Amendment #4 to FY16-19 TIP for Highway and Transit Elements

Project #608168-DOUGLAS-RESURFACING & RELATED WORK ON WEBSTER STREET (RTE 16) increase cost (difference will come from statewide funding) from \$1,750,000 to \$2,429,447 to reflect latest cost estimates.

Project # 604864 –WESTBOROUGH-INTERSECTION & SIGNAL IMPROVEMENTS AT RTE 9 & LYMAN ST-Increase cost (difference will come from statewide HSIP & CMAQ funding) from \$6,277,796 to \$8,057,763 to reflect latest cost estimate.

Project #606629-Change name from WORCESTER-BLACKSTONE VISITOR CENTER (PHASE II) to WORCESTER-BLACKSTONE VISITOR CENTER, INCLUDING PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE W-44-144 OVER THE MIDDLE RIVER (PHASE II). Cost will also increase by \$2M (from Statewide Enhancements funds) and increase by \$2.5 million from Statewide CMAQ funds and increase by \$1,548,932 from NFA funding. New total project cost is \$14,957,599.

Project #605674 – STURBRIDGE – GRAND TRUNK TRAIL move from FY17 to FY16. Cost of the project will remain the same at \$507,500.

Project #608041 and Project #608043 – Combine these two projects into one project which will now be called **Project #608043** – BOYLSTON – WEST BOYLSTON – STORMWATER IMPROVEMENTS ON ROUTE 140 WACHUSETT RESERVOIR SOUTH BAY AND BEAMAN STREET. Project will be added in FY16 with a cost of \$4,508,748 with Statewide TE funding.

Project #607176 - Increase cost of SHREWSBURY – WESTBOROUGH – RESURFACING AND RELATED WORK ON ROUTE 9 by \$2,265,358 using Statewide STP. New total project cost is \$16,164,678.

Project #608170 - Reduce cost of—STURBRIDGE — REHABILITATION & RELATED WORK ON BROOKFIELD ROAD (ROUTE 148), FROM MAIN STREET (MM0.0) TO TOWN LINE (MM3.4) and also change project description. The cost will be reduced by \$259,650 and the project description will change to STURBRIDGE — SIGN AND PAVEMENT MARKING INSTALLATION AND UPGRADES, LIMITED ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS AND RELATED WORK ON BROOKFIELD ROAD (ROUTE 148), FROM I-90 TO BROOKFIELD T.L. New project total cost is \$740,350.
