RE: Changes to State Election Laws: Chapter 115 of the Acts of 2020

The purpose of this memo is to provide information on changes to the Massachusetts state election laws. As you may be aware, House Bill 4820, An Act relative to voting options in response to COVID-19, was passed by the House and Senate last week and was just signed into law as Chapter 115 of the Acts of 2020.

#### **VOTER REGISTRATION**

- The voter registration deadline for any election held on or before December 31, 2020 shall be 10 days before the election.
- The deadline to register to vote for the September 1st State Primary will be Saturday, August 22nd.
- The deadline to register to vote for the November 3<sup>rd</sup> election will be Saturday, October 24<sup>th</sup>.

#### **VOTING BY MAIL**

- The deadline to request an absentee ballot by mail or mail-in early ballot will be 5 p.m. on the 4<sup>th</sup> business day before an election.
- For the Tuesday, September 1, 2020 State Primary the deadline is August 26th at 5 P.M.
- For the Tuesday, November 3, 2020 Presidential Election the deadline is October 28<sup>th</sup> at 5 P.M.

#### RETURNING VOTING BY MAIL BALLOTS

- Mail-in ballots may be returned in person, by mail, or by secured drop box outside City Hall, 455 Main St, Worcester, MA 01608.
- All State Primary ballots still need to be returned by 8 p.m. on September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020 in order to be counted.
- Early ballots for the State Election must be postmarked by **November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2020 and received no later than 5 p.m.** on November 6th in order to be counted.












## **Proposed Location for Ward 7 - Precinct 3 Stearns Tavern, 140 Mill Street, Worcester**
