

a Blackstone Canal - Harding Street

Beneath this street, a portion of the Blackstone Canal operated from 1828 to 1848. With the opening of the canal, the population of Worcester soon doubled and business grew dramatically. The Canal offered the landlocked community a transportation link to the seaport in Providence, RI. This section of the Canal was completely covered over by 1893.

b Crompton Loom Works - 132-142 Green Street

This factory was built in 1860 for the manufacturing of textiles and looms. It is one of the oldest surviving factory buildings in Worcester. Currently, the building houses businesses including the Crompton Collective, a curated boutique marketplace, among others.

c Lucky Dog Music Hall - 91 Green Street

Since becoming a nightclub in the 1980s, this building has hosted many popular acts. This building's greatest claim to fame is an "unforgettable" Rolling Stones concert held here at Sir Morgan's Cove in 1981.

d John T. Cahill House - 42 Green Street

With its facade now hidden behind a 1960s metal screen, it is hard to imagine that this Italianate-style brick mansion was once among Worcester's grandest houses. The building is now home of the Worcester Hibernian Cultural Center, which celebrates Irish heritage and culture. The organization hopes to restore the facade to its historic appearance.
