Monday August 7, 2023, 6:00pm Meeting Minutes

- The Chair called meeting to order at 6:00 and informed the public of the purpose and goals of the board, including addressing institutional racism.
- The Chair read a statement regarding the work of the Human Rights Commission:
 - The Human Rights Commission was established to promote the city's human rights policies. It is the policy of the City to assure equal access, for every individual, to and benefit from all public services, to protect every individual in the enjoyment and exercise of civil rights and to encourage and bring about mutual understanding and respect among all individuals in the city. It is the goal of HRC to ensure that all City residents are treated fairly and equally by eliminating bigotry, discrimination, intolerance, and prejudice. Our work requires us to address institutional racism so that as a community we can achieve racial equity. Our work also requires us to make visible the unheard, unearned, and unquestioned privilege enjoyed by some member of our community to the detriment of others. We take time to make this acknowledgment, to educate so a path can be cleared for healing.
 - The term "institutional racism" refers specifically to the ways in which institutional policies create different outcomes for different racial groups. The institutional policies may never mention any racial group, but their effect is to create advantages for whites and the oppression and disadvantage for people from groups classified as people of color. The term "racial equity" is the active state in which race does not determines one's livelihood or success. It is achieved through proactive work to address root causes of inequalities to improve outcomes for all individuals. That is, through the elimination or shifting of policies, practices, attitudes, and cultural messages that reinforce differential outcomes by race or fail to eliminate them. The term "privilege" describes the unearned social power and informal institutions of society to all members of a dominant group. For example: "white privilege" and "male privilege." Privilege is usually invisible to those who have it because we are trained to not see it but nevertheless it puts them at an advantage against those who do not have it.

• The Chair read a statement honoring the Nipmuc People:

 We acknowledge the traditional and ancestral territory of the Nipmuc, the first people of Massachusetts and those whose lands we are convening on tonight. While the Nipmuc history predates written history, records from the 1600's inform us that the original inhabitants of Worcester dwelled principally in three locations: Pakachoag, Tatesset (Tatnuck) and Wigwam Hill (N. Lake Ave). It is important to make this acknowledgement and to honor the ancestors that have come before us. It is all too easy to live in a land without ever hearing the traditional names and the history of the people who first resided and prospered in these lands and continue to reside and prosper.

- Introductions of board members and guests:
 - Present from the board: Chairperson Ellen Shemitz, Vice Chairperson Elizabeth O'Callahan, Robert Bilotta, Guillermo Creamer Jr., Dr. Bernard Reese, Jamaine Ortiz
- Introduction of WPD Diversity Officers:
 - Sgt. Angel Miranda and Officer Casey Onuigbo have been assigned to the Diversity Unit for the Department.
 - They will serve as new point of contact for all HRC requests

• Introduction of new Interim Executive Director for the Office of Human Rights and Accessibility:

- Victor Perez, Esq. serving as the Lead Investigation and Interim Executive Director for Human Rights and Accessibility Offices. His background is in discrimination law, and he worked at MCAD, the state civil rights agency, which enforces Massachusetts civil rights laws and partners with the federal government to enforce related laws. He has been doing this work for about a decade, is passionate about it and looking forward to working with the Human Rights Office and doing this good work.
- Approval of meeting minutes from June 12, 2023, and July 10, 2023
 - Board approved meeting minutes from July 10, 2023, but did not have a quorum for the June 12, 2023, minutes and will be tabled until the next meeting.
 - Board unanimously approved July 10, 2023, minutes with roll call vote.
- Annual meeting with the Worcester Police Department (Continued from July 10, 2023) TABLED to September 11, 2023, Meeting
 - Follow up questions from July 10 conversation is tabled until next meetings as officers were not able to attend this meeting. Chair shared disappointment that the officers won't be at this meeting to follow up from last meeting, but is hopeful they will finish next meeting. The Board has hopes and expectations that they will be able to finish the questions with Captain D 'Andrea and Officer Doherty at the September meeting. The Board also hopes to follow up with questions pending with WPD, as listed in July meeting agenda. The Diversity Office will be the new point of contact for all information requests, and this will hopefully streamline the process.

• Welcome to Sgt. Angel Miranda and Officer Casey Onuigbo

- Sgt. Miranda clarified their roles; they will be in support of the HRC, but the personal contact will not be them but will be higher command staff. They stated they were there in support, but not to answer the questions. The department heads will answer the questions.
- Chair asked for clarification on what they meant by "support." Sgt. Miranda said the Officers have been in their new roles for 3 months, and this is all new to them. They wanted to come and introduce themselves as the Diversity Officers for the WPD. They will be working on retention and recruiting diverse populations to be officers. They are not privy to answering the board's questions regarding anything that does not pertain to the diversity work they do. Questions would be referred to the Chief.
- Commissioner Creamer said HRC wants to open lines of communication with HRC and the Chief of Police. Would like to strengthen the pipeline between WPD and the board. There was a time when the Chief was at the table with them. As residents in the role, they have now, the Board

only wants to help build on the work the Diversity Officers are trying to do and close the gap between the residents and the WPD. Commissioner Creamer expressed frustration because information being requested is somewhat routine and there has been ample time to get them together. His hope is to strengthen the pipeline between WPD and the HRC because so many residents are looking for this. He hoped this is reiterated up the chain of command.

- The Chair sent document a few months ago, Section 10, Article 10 of the City Ordinances organizing the Human Rights Commission and the rights and responsibilities. Primary among the listed rights and responsibilities is reviewing departmental policy and reviewing department disciplinary actions and ensuring policies and actions are not depriving any city resident of civil rights or human rights. The work that the HRC does with the WPD is essential to their core mission and is fully authorized by the City Ordinances. The HRC wants to ensure that they work in partnership with the police and ensure the voices of residents are heard.
- Mr. Perez clarified some points based on communications involving the WPD since the HRC agenda was posted. The Diversity Officers will be 2 of 3 points of contact for information, the other will be Captain Davenport from the Bureau of Professional Standards. The Diversity Officers will be answering questions that pertain to their work and Capt. Davenport will respond to questions relative to his work.
- The Chair stated that there were outstanding questions pertaining to the Diversity Office. The board had asked Captain D 'Andrea for promotional civil service tests. They asked for information on the Civil Promotional exam; the relative pass rates by gender, ethnic and race and all the HRC received was the percentage of people who passed who identified as women, various ethnicities etc. This is inadequate and the HRC asked for the relative passage rate for gender, race, ethnicity. HRC was told they would have it today.
- Sgt. Miranda reported that Nina Galica in HR sent the request to HRD in Boston, and they were waiting to get it back. The information should be available for next meeting.
- The Vice Chair expressed hope that Diversity Officers could provide information next meeting and that Captain Davenport would be joining as well.
- The Chair asked for information about complaints that were lodged against police officers and asked for it broken down by gender, race, and ethnicity but the information is not available. She asked if they could address that or describe what might be preventing WPD from collecting that data. Sgt. Miranda said Diversity Officers are not privy to this information, it falls under Bureau of Professional Standards.
- Commissioner Creamer asked Diversity Officers if they were included in policy making in regarding to DEI when it comes to functioning of the WPD. Sgt. Miranda stated that they talk to the Chief when it comes to inter-departmental issues and any type of discrimination. They have an open-door policy with the Chief. If there is an issue in the Department, the Diversity Officers handle it. The Chief has zero tolerance policy for any type of discrimination and there is something the Diversity Officers worked on with Sgt. Leto and they are continuing with the Chief. There is a chain of command to follow but they have the blessing to go directly to the Chief and bring anything related to discrimination to him.
- Commissioner Creamer asked if there were limitations that affect their work, and what they hoped to get to advance the DEI agenda for WPD. Sgt. Miranda is hoping to change the culture and get everyone on the same page, which he felt might be difficult. The Department's structure is unique and there is chain of command to follow, but he is hoping to get everyone on the same page. Zero tolerance is something they are trying to promote.
- Officer Onuigbo stated that from a recruiting aspect, they are trying to make sure the

Department looks like the communities they serve. It's hard to reach out to the parts of the community who do not have a positive outlook on the police department. He tries to reach out to people he sees in church and the community and on patrols, and to do the research and to have them see what is really happening rather than listen to media. He felt this to be a challenge for him.

- The Chair asked about the Citizen Police Academy, which did not resume after COVID. Sgt. Miranda said the Diversity Officers did not know about the Citizen Police Academy, they have been working with the cadet program, a recruiting program for individuals between 19 and 23. The Cadet program hires them to work in WPD for 2 years with certain administrative duties and if they take the Civil Service exam they are catapulted up. All 5 of the Cadets are going forward to be police officers. The WPD will be recruiting 10 more for January. In response to a question from the Chair, the Diversity Officers stated that out of the 5 Cadets, 3 are female and 4 are a minority status. Officer Onuigbo said they were wrapping up the cadet program and beginning the Police Academy, and suggested there might be a relationship between the two causing the delay. He offered that the Diversity Officers could look into that.
- Commissioner Creamer asked Diversity Officers about racist texts messages that recently came to light, and asked if this was brought to them and was in their purview. Sgt. Miranda said it was not. Commissioner Creamer asked if this issue was on their docket, and Sgt. Miranda said he did not know what the text was. The Chair referred to an article in the paper about a custodian. The Diversity Officer said he could not comment on an open investigation. Commissioner Creamer asked whether the matter is on the Diversity Officers' docket now that the matter is public. Sgt. Miranda said no and the custodian does not work for WPD.
- The Chair asked if Sgt. Miranda read anything in the paper about the matter that surprised him in regards to WPD culture. Sgt. Miranda said he did not read the article.
- Board members referred to an article about a racist text and asked Sgt. Miranda if this was on his docket. Sgt. Miranda stated he cannot speak to this matter.
- The Vice Chair stated that she thought if a formal complaint came Captain Davenport would be able to speak to it. If it was the Bureau of Professional Standards, it may be handed up to another department. Regarding the racial breakdown of complaints, Capt. Davenport came before the board in July 2018 meeting minutes. Chris Robarge from ACLU was present and said the WPD was way behind on capturing that data for the vast majority of police encounters. The HRC had questions regarding breakdown of demographic complaints so they can make data driven policy recommendations. Capt. Davenport said that if a resident makes a complaint by email or phone, they are not able to capture the demographic information and going on there were pieces that would capture this information in the complaint process. The HRC had this conversation prior, and the Vice Chair wanted to keep going and trying to get this information.
- Chair stated that Jayna Turchek had many emails going back to WPD on use of force complaints still had no demographic information and that was problematic. In 2018, the board made the request for breakdown of gender, ethnicity, and race of resident complaints so they can look at trends and make policy recommendations.
- The Chair requested that Mr. Perez will affirm Capt. Davenport's attendance next meeting and for information on the breakdown of use of force and other resident complaints prior to next meeting so HRC can discuss with him. Capt. Davenport also said in response to information requests that is not the policy of the department to release disciplinary information, however, this inconsistent with prior agreements.

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- Chair opened questions from board members and the public, however there were no further questions or comments.
 - The Chair thanked Sgt. Miranda and Officer Onuigbo for their time and looks forward to working with them.
 - The Chair stated she has had numerous conversations with Mr. Perez and hopes to have Captain Davenport attend the next meeting and send the requested information in advance of the next meeting so commissioners would have time to review prior to the September meeting so they can be informed and ask questions.

• Meeting with City Manager Eric Batista:

- On July 28, 2023, Jayna Turchek along with Chair Shemitz, Vice Chair O'Callahan, Commissioner Creamer met with City Manager Eric Batista, Asst. City Manager Hung Nguyen, and Victor Perez. It was a multi fold purpose meeting to discuss the smooth functioning of the HRC with Ms. Turchek leaving, and to clarify the status of the reorganization of the DEI office and to discuss the length of time it takes to get requested data from the Police Department. The City Manager stated that Mr. Perez is the interim Executive Director for the Human Rights. The City Manager said the hiring of the new Director of Human Rights and Accessibility, in the best world he expects to have a Director on board in 4-8 weeks, however it could take longer. He also stated that there would be a new job description, however, it has not been created yet. The Chair stated this could have implications on the hiring of the new Director. He also is not going to wait to hire the new CEO of DEI. The reality is Mr. Perez already has a full-time job and more demands have been placed on him so there is some sense of urgency to make the commission is fully staffed and the City Manager heard that and committed to moving forward with all due diligence. Board members said they wanted to make sure the work HRC are doing are aligned with the priorities that he sets particularly in DEI and if he had particular areas he wanted them to focus on.
- The Chair indicated that ensuring that the obvious focus was to ensure Police Dept was advancing Race and Equity because it is the biggest public facing department in the city and they wanted to make sure it consistent with HRC's goals of diversity, and eliminate racial discrimination.
- The HRC also told the City Manager they wanted to go deeper into homelessness and housing and expressed frustration that the new Homelessness Commission named by City Ordinance has not been created yet but has been on the books for 10 years. City Manager Batista said he would look into it.
- Participants talked a little bit about the timeline for hiring the new director and the reorganization, and the City Manager said they were six months into an 18-month timeline but that there is a subgroup in his office meeting regularly to increase the pace of the reorganization.
- Finally, participants talked to him about outstanding data requests with WPD so that HRC could do their work and advance their mission. The City Manager said he would be meeting coming up with the Chief of Police and push to make ensure the data is provided. He also said he would talk about setting a date for the next Citizen Academy and opening posting for police ride alongs. Participants reiterated that leadership of the HRC meeting quarterly with an officer of the City Manager, and he was amenable to that. Mr. Perez is working to get those on the books on a regular basis.
- Commissioner Creamer stated that the City Manager and office that Commission staffing

support was not what it should be and there was not the support for more. Participants asked what a civilian review board would look like. The HRC has the complete skeleton of what a civilian review board would be like, and this is the direction what we are heading to. They discussed identifying people with specific skills, what it means for recruiting going forward, and some being timed out soon. The manager was taking this into consideration.

- The Vice Chair discussed that this is a time to evaluate HRC work and even though there is reorganization going on and the work of this commission has been going on for years. There are number of things over the years that the commission has done to support members of the public. HRC should identify what is working and what HRC should continue. She wants to highlight some of the work they completed with the City Manager. The Chair stated that the Vice Chair will be putting together a memo of HRC accomplishments to help build upon success and work towards fulfilling the HRC's mission.
- Commissioner Bilotta raised the issue of not losing sight of the Accessibility Commission and citizens with disabilities, and to keep them first as well.

The City Manager asked for volunteers to help with the search for new Chief Diversity and Equity Officer:

- Mr. Perez said the idea is to have one representative/stakeholder from Accessibility Commission and the HRC to exchange information and ideas with the contract company regarding the new position of Chief Diversity Officer. The Chairperson on the Accessibility Commission has already been selected.
- Nominations for a volunteer to represent the HRC and Commissioner Creamer was nominated by Commissioner Reese. Motion was taken for a vote, and Commissioner Creamer was selected by unanimous note, with Commissioner Creamer abstaining.

Discussion of How to Move Forward:

- In the past there was a set schedule of meetings with different topics with new speaker discussing issues from human trafficking to police issue to fair housing, etc. HRC leadership has been discussing how the scope of issues HRC covers is very broad. If they try to cover all issues in the city, the risk is being well informed, but not necessarily affecting change. There was discussion of in the next 1-3 years trying to set a narrower focus where HRC makes dedicated dive and holds itself accountable with taking actions and executing follow up. The Chair referenced a 2018 agreement regarding demographic information with police department. The Chair asked whether narrowing the scope to address specific areas going forward.
- Commissioner Creamer pointed out that the hope is that HRC advances the interest of the City Manager. HRC has received marching order with a strong focus on WPD and investigations, which is new to HRC. Commissioner Creamer wants to make sure nothing is lost along the way.
 For example, he wants to make sure that the work the HRC did related to homelessness is actually addressed and taken up by the homelessness commission. He thinks that narrowing scope to matters such as WPD and human rights, not tapping into homelessness, is the direction the manager wants them to head in as a Commission.
- The Chair identified 2 topics of importance she would like to see 1) the transparency and accountability to ensure the protection of residents with their interactions with the WPD, and 2)

ensuring the City is protective of the human rights with the unhoused. Until the new commission gets formed, she feels the HRC should keep a close eye on the issue. She referenced a report from the AMA regarding the detrimental impact of homeless during homeless sweeps including morbidity and health concerns. The policy is to conduct homeless sweeps and that is in direct conflict with best research coming out of the AMA. HRC should be providing forums for those voices.

- A third issue she identified: the continued struggle with disengage residents regarding voting rates of 11% during non-presidential elections. The Chair said it was concerning to ensure the work of the city is reflective of the needs and desires of all residents.
- The Chair encouraged members to think about where they would like to focus on and put on a future agenda so that there are more intentional planning sessions and identified outcomes that members wish to see.
- Officer Onuigbo asked about homeless sweeps. The Chair described sweeps as including homeless camps being broken down and residents losing their possessions. Officer Onuigbo stated that outside agencies come in and do help the unhoused with services and housing, but sometimes the homeless person can't stay in housing and is back to being homeless. The Chair said that current sweeps are not best practice. The reality is that is sometimes a retractable problem with a myriad of complications. The Chair said she knows that current sweeps being conducted are not best practice when it comes to the long-term health and wellbeing of these individuals. The HRC does not have he resources to come up with a comprehensive policy, it can be a voice against a policy that is not consistent with best practices. In terms of mental health, sweeps like this can exacerbate the issues.
- The Vice-Chair highlighted the poor state of the mental health system and HRC hope is to support what experts in this area are recommending. In the past, HRC has discussed these issues and highlighted resources within their posted minutes.
- The Vice-Chair reference outside conversation with the Chair and three other Commissioners. She expressed excitement in addressing the third issues mentioned earlier.
- Commissioners attending the hearing on Wednesday with the Elections Commissions are Commissioners Shemitz, O'Callahan, and Reese.
- There was no public comment on this topic.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:13 PM by a unanimous vote.

HRC Members would attend the Elections Meeting on Wednesday. The next monthly meeting of the Human Rights Commission is Monday, September 11, 2023 at 6:00 pm.

Please indicate for each such case whether criminal prosecution against the officer(s) ensued and the result of any such prosecution.

It has been our policy not to disclose disciplinary action imposed. See case number 2019-0044 within the 2019 BOPS Annual Report for a sustained finding of Submitting reports that pertain to inaccurate reporting. No criminal prosecution.

Follow up questions on HRC Agenda:




Geographic Location of Complaints

The City of Worcester is divided into 20 patrol routes. RT.'s 4, 5, and 14 had the most complaints.




RT. 4 – 4 complaints


Rt. 5 – 5 Complaints



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
Geographic Location of Complaints

The City of Worcester is divided into 20 patrol routes. RT.'s 5 & 12 had the most complaints.




Rt. 5 – 14 Complaints (This number is high due to the complaints occurring at Worcester Police HQ)


RT 3 – 3 Complaints


Geographic Location of Complaints

The City of Worcester is divided into 20 patrol routes. RT.'s 3, 5, & 8 had the most complaints.




<mark>Rt. 5 – 7 Complaints</mark>


RT 3 – 5 Complaints


Geographic Location of Complaints






