# 13. The Pint LLC, 58 Shrewsbury Street

Officer Harrington observed as he went by the Pint that numerous cars were parked in the fire lane next the Licensed Premises building and parked his cruiser in attempt to located the owner of the vehicles to ask them to move them.

Officer Harrington proceeded to enter the Pint and observed it was very busy and appeared to be over capacity. When door staff were asked how many people were inside the premises, door staff stated 60. The occupancy for this Premises is 40.

Mr. Tonelli admitted to violation.

#### 14. Mansi Vijay Corp dba McGovern's Package Store, 82 Millbury Street

On January 26, 2020, Officers of the Worcester Police Department Alcohol Unit conducted compliance checks at various package stores throughout the city of Worcester. An underage male accompanied the officers and was instructed to enter a package store and attempt to purchase alcohol without providing identification.

At around 12:29 p.m. the underage male entered McGovern's Package Store and purchased a six pack of Bud Light 12 oz bottles. The male was able to purchase the alcohol without being asked for identification.

Attorney Porter stated that there was no dispute to what happen.

Attorney Porter stated that the establishment has been in business for two years with no violations.

Attorney Porter stated that all employees have had TIPS training and met with Lt. Johnson and have also had server training with Worcester Police.

Upon a roll call the Commission voted 2-0 that the violation did occur.

Upon a roll call the Commission voted 2-0 to issue a Warning.
