Mission Statement:

The Worcester Public Library serves as a gathering place that actively promotes the free exchange of ideas in our democratic society. The Library makes information available to all people while fostering intellectual freedom, protecting privacy, encouraging personal growth and enrichment, and celebrating our diverse community heritage.

The following outlines the purpose and responsibilities of the Worcester Public Library Board of Directors. The Library operates under the 1859 *Deed of Gift* by Dr. John Green, with rules that derive specifically from the *Gift*.

PURPOSE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board Provides for:

- Managerial policies for the establishment, curtailment, and administration of library services;
- Promulgation of rules and regulations governing the use of the library;
- Appointments of staff upon recommendation of the Head Librarian;
- Authorization of agreements in conjunction with the City Manager for services concerning the library;
- Hiring and evaluating the Head Librarian who serves at the pleasure of the Board.

Dr. Green stipulated, "The management of the Library, the custody of the books, and the regulations under which they may be used shall be vested in the Board."

COMPOSTITION

• Twelve directors, two appointed each December by the City Council for a six-year term.

REQUIREMENTS

- Monthly meetings held the fourth Wednesday at 5:00pm
- Service on 2-3 standing committees

REPRESENTATION

- Geographic
- Ethnic
- Economic and education
- Age, gender, and abilities
- Skills

- Securing an appropriate funding level for facilities, technology, hours of operation, collections and staff
- Knowing and observing applicable municipal, state, and federal laws and regulations

- Pursuing educational opportunities that expand skills necessary to be an Executive Director

POSITION DESCRIPTION - WORCESTER PUBLIC LIBRARY BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Composition: There are twelve (12) members of the Worcester Public Library's Board of Directors. Two directors are appointed by the City Council each December. The term of service for a director is six (6) years.

Requirements: Directors must be residents of Worcester. The Board's monthly meetings are held on the fourth Wednesday of each month at 5:00 p.m., usually at the Main Library. Directors serve on 2 to 3 standing committees that meet as work requires, usually 5 or 6 times a year.

Representation: Because the Public Library serves the entire community, it is desirable to have Board representation that reflects a cross section of the population. Examples of representation are:

Geographic - people from neighborhoods throughout the city

Ethnic - people reflecting the ethnic and racial groups within the city

Skills - people with expertise in areas such as management, finance, public relations, construction, architecture, fund raising, law, etc.

Economic and Education - people with various income and education levels

Age and Sex - people representing a range of ages and a balance between men and women

Responsibilities: The Board of Directors governs the library for the benefit of the community. It fulfills its responsibilities by:

- employing a qualified head librarian and understanding the roles and responsibilities of the Board and the head librarian
- setting service-oriented library policies that uphold the principles of equal access to information and the free exchange of ideas
- overseeing the management and maintenance of the library's facilities and assets
- working to secure an appropriate funding level for facilities, technology, hours of operation, collections and staff
- knowing and observing applicable municipal, state and federal laws and regulations
- working with the community to identify information needs and to develop and implement a written plan for the maintenance and improvement of library services
- pursuing educational opportunities that expand skills necessary to be an effective Director.

Compensation: Library Directors serve without monetary compensation.
