WORCESTER PROCLAIMS 11/17/2024 AS WORLD DAY OF REMEMBRANCE FOR ROAD TRAFFIC VICTIMS

ITEM 4B: MAYOR PETTY READ A PROCLAMATION DECLARING NOVEMBER 17, 2024 AS WORLD DAY OF REMEMBRANCE FOR ROAD TRAFFIC VICTIMS IN THE CITY. THE PROCLAMATION WAS PRESENTED TO KARIN VALENTINE GOINS, WHO SPOKE CONCERNING THE ITEM.

AT THE CITY COUNCIL MEETING ON NOVEMBER 12TH, MAYOR JOSEPH PETTY ISSUED A PROCLAMATION DECLARING NOVEMBER 17, 2024, AS WORLD DAY OF REMEMBRANCE FOR ROAD TRAFFIC VICTIMS IN THE CITY OF WORCESTER. THE PROCLAMATION HONORS THE LIVES LOST AND THOSE AFFECTED BY ROAD TRAFFIC INCIDENTS, EMPHASIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF ROAD SAFETY AND AWARENESS.

WORLD DAY OF REMEMBRANCE FOR ROAD TRAFFIC VICTIMS IS PART OF A GLOBAL INITIATIVE TO ACKNOWLEDGE THE ONGOING IMPACT OF TRAFFIC-RELATED TRAGEDIES. THE PROCLAMATION WAS HANDED TO KARIN VALENTINE GOINS IN RECOGNITION OF HER ADVOCACY FOR SAFER STREETS AND COMMUNITY SUPPORT.



WORCESTER CITY COUNCIL UNANIMOUSLY APPROVES RECOMMENDATION TO RAISE THE MAXIMUM AGE FOR POLICE OFFICERS

ITEM 9.3A: RECOMMEND AUTHORIZATION TO FILE THE PROPOSED LEGISLATION TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM AGE OF ELIGIBILITY TO BE CERTIFIED FOR ORIGINAL APPOINTMENT AS A POLICE OFFICER IN THE CITY OF WORCESTER AT 39 YEARS OF AGE.

MAYOR PETTY READ THE ITEM AND MOVED FOR A ROLL CALL VOTE TO ADOPT THE ITEM. ORDER ADOPTED ON A ROLL CALL VOTE OF 11 YEAS AND 0 NAYS

AT THE NOVEMBER 12TH CITY COUNCIL MEETING, THE WORCESTER CITY COUNCIL UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED A RECOMMENDATION BY CITY MANAGER ERIC BATISTA TO PURSUE LEGISLATION RAISING THE MAXIMUM AGE FOR POLICE OFFICER ELIGIBILITY FROM 32 TO 39. THE CHANGE AIMS TO ADDRESS A SIGNIFICANT DECLINE IN APPLICANTS, FROM 1,200-1,500 ANNUALLY TO JUST 200-250 IN RECENT YEARS. MAYOR JOSEPH PETTY INTRODUCED THE ITEM, AND EMPHASIZED THE NEED TO EXPAND THE CANDIDATE POOL TO BETTER SERVE THE COMMUNITY. THE PROPOSAL MIRRORS SIMILAR STEPS TAKEN IN CITIES LIKE BOSTON AND TAUNTON TO ADDRESS RECRUITMENT CHALLENGES.

VETERANS' DAY EVENTS IN WORCESTER

MONDAY – 11/11/2024

ON MONDAY, NOVEMBER 11, WORCESTER HONORED ITS VETERANS STARTING THE DAY OFF WITH THE ANNUAL VETERANS DAY PANCAKE BREAKFAST AND PARADE. DRAWING AN IMPRESSIVE TURNOUT FROM THE COMMUNITY, HUNDREDS GATHERED FOR THE COMPLIMENTARY PANCAKE BREAKFAST IN THE HISTORIC ARMORY AND DR. JOE ROBINSON, WORCESTER'S DIRECTOR OF VETERANS SERVICES, NOTED THAT ATTENDANCE AT THE PARADE DOUBLED COMPARED TO THE PREVIOUS YEAR, HIGHLIGHTING GROWING COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT.

DURING THE SOLEMN CEREMONY COMMEMORATING LT. JASON MENARD'S BRAVERY, MAYOR JOSEPH PETTY HONORED MENARD'S SACRIFICE, RECOGNIZING HIM AS THE "EMBODIMENT OF A HERO" AND HIGHLIGHTING THE CITY'S UNWAVERING RESPECT FOR THOSE WHO SERVE SELFLESSLY.

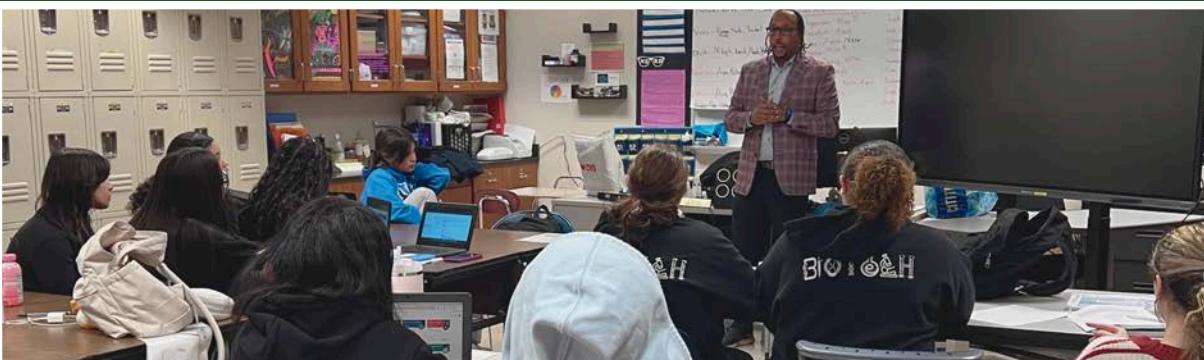

THE WORLD DAY OF REMEMBRANCE FOR ROAD TRAFFIC VICTIMS IS A GLOBAL EVENT HELD EVERY THIRD SUNDAY OF NOVEMBER TO HONOR THOSE WHO HAVE LOST THEIR LIVES OR HAVE BEEN IMPACTED BY ROADWAY CRASHES.

WORCESTER HAS EXPERIENCED A TRAGIC YEAR ON ITS ROADWAYS, WITH A NUMBER OF FATALITIES AND SERIOUS INJURIES.

RESIDENTS AND ELECTED OFFICIALS, INCLUDING DISTRICT 5 CITY COUNCILOR ETEL HAXHIAJ WHO HELPED TO ORGANIZE THE EVENT AND MAYOR JOSEPH PETTY, GATHERED TO HONOR VICTIMS AND REAFFIRM THEIR COMMITMENT TO THE WORCESTER VISION ZERO PLAN, WHICH AIMS TO ELIMINATE ROADWAY DEATHS AND SEVERE INJURIES.

THE EVENT TOOK PLACE OUTSIDE THE WORCESTER AUDITORIUM AND ATTENDEES WERE ENCOURAGED TO WEAR YELLOW, SYMBOLIZING TRAFFIC SAFETY.



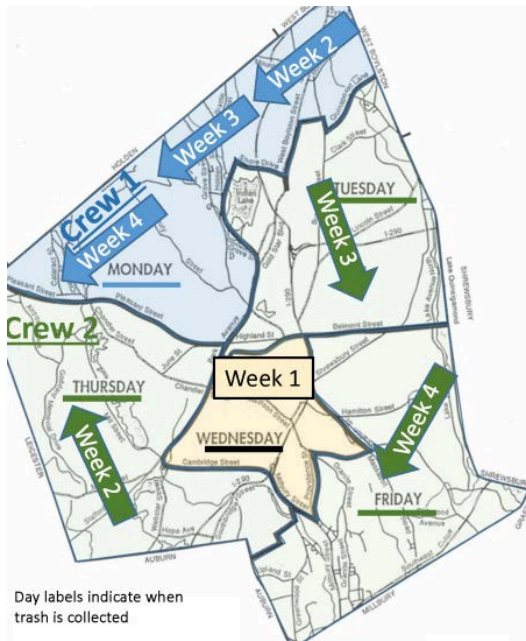

WHEN IS MY LEAF COLLECTION?

2024 Fall Leaf Collection Program

The Department of Public Works & Parks will begin collecting leaves starting Monday, November 4, 2024

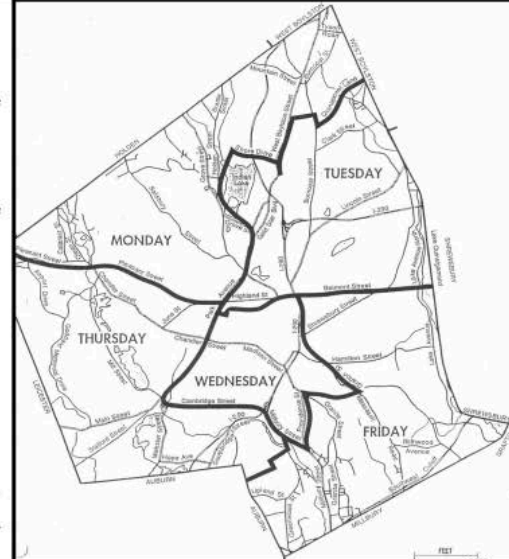


Leaf collection will begin in the section of the city that has trash collected on Wednesdays. After collecting leaves in the Wednesday area, leaves will be collected in the Monday, Thursday, Tuesday, and Friday trash collection areas. The leaf collection program is expected to take 4 to 5 weeks to complete, depending on the weather.

Streets will be posted prior to leaf collection to provide advance notification to residents that a **No Parking Ban** will be in effect while leaves are being collected. **ALERTWorcester** will be used to notify neighborhoods of their pending collection. Up-to-date information on where leaf collection is occurring will be advertised in the Worcester Telegram & Gazette and on the Government Access Channel 192. Information can also be obtained from the City's website at www.worcesterma.gov/dpw/seasonal-information/fall-leaf-collection or by calling the Customer Service Center by dialing 311 or 508-929-1300.

7 am to 5 pm

- When you see that your neighborhood is posted with leaf collection signs, you can then rake the leaves into the gutter. You can also use paper, biodegradable leaf collection bags to hold your leaves.
- Do not block catch basins because this may cause flooding during a rainstorm. Do not park on top of piles of leaves as this may cause a fire.
- Leaves will not be collected in locations where residents rake leaves into the street after the street has been swept.
- Only leaves and grass clippings can be collected with leaf collection equipment (NO PLASTIC BAGS OF LEAVES, BRUSH, OR BRANCHES WILL BE COLLECTED. YOU MAY USE BIODEGRADABLE BAGS FOR LEAVES AND GRASS).
- Any brush or tree branches must be taken to the Millbury Street DPW&P Yard Waste Drop-Off Site. Bagged leaves can be taken to the Millbury Street Site, Clark Street (near the intersection of East Mountain Street), or the Chandler Street Site (across from Foley Stadium) on Wednesdays 8:30 - 3, Saturdays 9 - 4. The Millbury Street Site is also open on Sundays from 9 - 4.
