VICE CHAIRMAN KHRYSTIAN E. KING, AND
MAYOR JOSEPH PETTY ATTENDED A MEET AND GREET WITH
THE WORCESTER YOUTH COUNCIL. THE EVENT FOSTERED
DIALOGUE BETWEEN CITY LEADERS AND YOUTH
REPRESENTATIVES, HIGHLIGHTING THE IMPORTANCE OF

GROUND BREAKING CEREMONY - 10/24

DISTRICT 2 CITY COUNCILOR CANDY MERO-CARLSON SPOKE AT THE ECOTARIUM'S EXPANSION CELEBRATION ON 10/24, WHERE SHE EXPRESSED EXCITEMENT FOR THE MUSEUM'S GROWTH. THE COUNCILOR HIGHLIGHTED THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE NEW 8,300 SQUARE FOOT EXHIBIT HALL, DESIGNED BY ANNUM ARCHITECTS OF BOSTON, AND PRAISED THE ECOTARIUM AS A CULTURAL ASSET FOR WORCESTER. 


COMMUNITY ONE STOP FOR GROWTH AWARDS CELEBRATION - 10/24



- NEVER ACCEPT RIDES FROM STRANGERS OR ENTER A STRANGER'S HOME.







WHEN IS MY LEAF COLLECTION?

2024 Fall Leaf Collection Program

The Department of Public Works & Parks will begin collecting leaves starting Monday, November 4, 2024



Leaf collection will begin in the section of the city that has trash collected on Wednesdays. After collecting leaves in the Wednesday area, leaves will be collected in the Monday, Thursday, Tuesday, and Friday trash collection areas. The leaf collection program is expected to take 4 to 5 weeks to complete, depending on the

Streets will be posted prior to leaf collection to provide advance notification to residents that a No Parking Ban will be in effect while leaves are being collected. ALERTWorcester will be used to notify neighborhoods of their pending collection. Up-to-date information on where leaf collection is occurring will be advertised in Worcester Telegram & Gazette and on the Government Access Channel 192. Information can also be obtained from the City's website www.worcesterma.gov/dpw/seasonal-information/fall-<u>leaf-collection</u> or by calling the Customer Service Center by dialing 311 or 508-929-1300.

When you see that your neighborhood is posted with leaf collection signs, you can then rake the leaves into the gutter. You can also use paper,

Do not block catch basins because this may cause flooding during a rainstorm. Do not park on top of piles of leaves as this may cause a fire.

Leaves will not be collected in locations where residents rake leaves into the street after the street has been swept

Only leaves and grass clippings can be collected

with leaf collection equipment (NO PLASTIC BAGS OF LEAVES, BRUSH, OR BRANCHES WILL BE COLLECTED. YOU MAY USE BIODEGRADABLE BAGS FOR LEAVES AND GRASS).

LEAF

leaves can be taken to the Millbury Street Site, Clark Street (near the intersection of East Mountain Street), or the Chandler Street Site (across from Foley Stadium) on Wednesdays 8:30 - 3, Saturdays 9 - 4. The Millbury Street Site is also open on Sundays from 9 - 4.

Any brush or tree branches must be taken to the Millbury Street DPW&P Yard Waste Drop-Off Site. Bagged
