City Council Advances Effort to Create Women's Homeless **Shelter**

RESOLUTION 21C.

THAT THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WORCESTER HERBY SUPPORTS THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A HOMELESS SHELTER DEDICATED TO WOMEN

THE WORCESTER CITY COUNCIL UNANIMOUSLY VOTED TO SUPPORT THE EFFORTS TO ESTABLISHING A SHELTER FOR HOMELESS WOMEN IN THE CITY. THE RESOLUTION WAS BROUGHT FORTH BY VICE CHAIRMAN/ COUNCILOR AT-LARGE KHYRSTIAN KING. ADVOCATES IN THE CITY HAVE BROUGHT THIS ISSUE UP TO PROTECT HOMELESS WOMEN WHO HAVE BEEN EXPLOITED.

THE CITY PREVIOUSLY HAD A WOMEN'S HOMELESS SHELTER ON LINCOLN STREET WHICH CLOSED IN 2023, IN DECEMBER. CITY COUNCIL ADVANCED A PETITION ESTABLISHING A HOMELESS SHELTER FOR WOMEN TO THE SUBCOMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH.



City Council Advances Item Aimed at **Expanding Street Trash** and Recycling Receptacles

ITEM 12G.

CITY MANAGER TRANSMITTING INFORMATIONAL COMMUNICATION RELATIVE TO EXPANDING STREET TRASH AND RECYCLING RECEPTACLES

THE WORCESTER CITY COUNCIL VOTED TO ADVANCE AN ITEM AIMED AT EXPANDING STREET TRASH AND RECYCLING RECEPTACLES AS DESCRIBED IN WORCESTER'S FY25-29 STRATEGIC PLAN IN AN EFFORT TO BETTER ADDRESS THE STREET LITTER CONCERNS. THESE NEW RECEPTACLES WILL COLLECT BOTH TRASH AND RECYCLING.

THE DEPARTMENT OF SUSTAINABILITY AND RESILIENCE HAS LAUNCHED A CROWDSOURCE MAP TO SOLICIT INPUT FROM THE RESIDENTS TO BETTER DETERMINE THE PRIORITY AREAS FOR INITIAL PHASES OF INSTALLATION.

Worcester Announces Permanent Winter Parking Ban in Effect Dec. 1 Through April 30



The City of Worcester announced Friday November 22, it's **Permanent Winter Parking Ban** will go into effect **Dec. 1, 2024**, and will remain through **April 30, 2025 (April 1 for residential streets)**. The Permanent Winter Parking Ban applies to emergency arteries, WRTA bus routes, and streets that are critical to the flow of traffic. There is no parking on one or both sides of the affected street between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. nor any time a snow emergency is declared.

In addition to the Permanent Winter Parking Ban, a Declared Winter Parking Ban will go into effect on all other city streets whenever accumulating snow is forecast. When a declared ban is in effect, parking is allowed only on the odd-numbered side of other streets, unless posted otherwise, and municipal parking garages will be free to use until noted following the ban's lifting. Parking enforcement—including ticketing and towing—will be active during a Declared Ban, as adherence to parking bans is critical to allow municipal crews to keep roadways clear and safe.

Illegally parked vehicles are the biggest obstacle to effective snow removal efforts. Vehicles that violate the winter parking ban or otherwise hinder snow removal will be ticketed and towed at the owner's expense. Winter Parking Rules

Winter parking bans on public streets fall under two categories, PERMANENT and DECLARED.

- A PERMANENT BAN remains in effect from December 1st through April 30th on Emergency Arteries, WRTA
 Bus Routes, and streets that are critical to the flow of traffic. There is no parking on one or both sides of
 the street between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. and anytime a snow emergency is declared.
- A DECLARED BAN is put into effect on all remaining city streets whenever accumulating snow is forecast. When a Declared Ban is in effect, restrictions apply that typically allow parking on one side of the street.
