REQUEST CITY MANAGER PROVIDE CITY COUNCIL WITH A REPORT DETAILING THE PROCESS FOR MOVING FORWARD WITH INSTITUTIONAL MASTER PLANS (IMPS).

THE CITY COUNCIL ADOPTED AN ORDER FROM THE COMMITTEE ON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT REQUESTING THE CITY MANAGER PROVIDE THE CITY COUNCIL WITH A REPORT DETAILING THE PROCESS FOR MOVING FORWARD WITH INSTITUTIONAL MASTER PLANS (IMPS)

IMPS ARE DEVELOPMENT PLANS USED BY CERTAIN LARGE INSTITUTIONS SUCH AS HOSPITALS AND UNIVERSITIES THAT ALLOW THEM TO GROW AND DEVELOP THROUGH LARGE-SCALE PROJECTS WITH APPROVED GUIDELINES FROM COMMUNITY INPUT.

THE WORCESTER CITY COUNCIL ADVANCED AN ORDER REQUESTING THE CITY MANAGER PROVIDE THE CITY COUNCIL WITH AN UPDATE CONCERNING ANY MAINTENANCE SCHEDULED OVER THE LAST 4 YEARS AT THE ERNEST A. JOHNSON TUNNEL

OPENED IN 1956, THE ERNEST A. JOHNSON TUNNEL RUNS UNDER LINCOLN SQUARE INTO DOWNTOWN WORCESTER. THE TUNNEL WAS CLOSED IN MAY 2023 FOR CONSTRUCTION-RELATED ACTIVITIES AND RECENT REPORTS HAVE MADE CERTAIN ESTIMATES FOR REPAIRS MADE TO RE-OPEN THE TUNNEL AND ESTIMATES FOR PERMANENT CLOSURE.

THIS FREE ART EXHIBITION, WHICH RUNS FROM FEBRUARY 1 TO FEBRUARY 28 AT THE WORCESTER CENTER FOR CRAFTS, HIGHLIGHTS THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF AFRICAN AMERICAN LABOR IN THE UNITED STATES.

SIXTEEN ARTISTS FROM WORCESTER AND ACROSS NEW ENGLAND ARE FEATURED. WITH NEARLY 50 WORKS OF ART IN A VARIETY OF MEDIUMS. ECOTARIUM 2025 LUNAR NEW YEAR CELEBRATION - 2/1

MAYOR JOE PETTY, DISTRICT 2 CITY COUNCILOR CANDY MERO-CARLSON AND STATE SENATOR MICHAEL MOORE ATTENDED THE ECOTARIUM'S 2025 LUNAR NEW YEAR CELEBRATION. MAYOR PETTY AND COUNCILOR MERO-CARLSON SPOKE TO THE GATHERED CROWD BEFORE INTRODUCING A LIVE LION DANCE PERFORMANCE BY THE SUN LION DANCE TEAM FROM THE SOUTHEAST ASIAN COALITION OF CENTRAL MASSACHUSETTS.

THE LUNAR NEW YEAR IS A CELEBRATION OF THE ARRIVAL OF SPRING AND THE BEGINNING OF A NEW YEAR ON THE LUNISOLAR CALENDAR. COMMONLY KNOWN AS THE SPRING FESTIVAL IN CHINA, THE LUNAR NEW YEAR IS A 15-DAY CELEBRATION MARKED BY MANY TRADITIONS. 2025 IS THE YEAR OF THE SNAKE, SYMBOLIZING CHARM, INTELLIGENCE, AND AN OPPORTUNITY FOR CHANGE.





ECOTARIUM GROUND HOG DAY CELEBRATION - 2/2

MAYOR JOE PETTY, DISTRICT 2 CITY COUNCILOR CANDY MERO-CARLSON AND STATE SENATOR MICHAEL MOORE AT THE ECOTARIUM TO CELEBRATE GROUND HOG DAY. THIS AGE-OLD TRADITION THAT IS CELEBRATED THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY ON FEBRUARY 2ND EACH YEAR HAS A WORCESTER TWIST AT THE ECOTARIUM. CORNELIA, THE RESIDENT GROUNDHOG AT THE ECOTARIUM, PREDICTED 6 MORE WEEKS OF WINTER AS THEY SAW THEIR SHADOW ON SUNDAY FEBRUARY 2ND. THIS FUN TRADITION STARTED AT THE ECOTARIUM IN 2021 AND HAS BROUGHT JOY TO FAMILIES EVER SINCE.

GROUNDHOG DAY HAS BEEN CELEBRATED FOR OVER 100 YEARS IN THE UNITED STATES, ORIGINATING FROM PUNXSUTAWNEY PENNSYLVANIA IN 1887. THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE GATHER IN PUNXSUTAWNEY TO WATCH THEIR GROUNDHOG, "PUNXSUTAWNEY PHIL" MAKE THEIR WINTER PREDICTION. IF PHIL SEES HIS SHADOW, THEN SIX MORE WEEKS OF WINTER WILL ENSUE. IF PHIL DOES NOT SEE HIS SHADOW, THEN AN EARLY SPRING WILL ARRIVE. OVER THE SPAN OF THIS TRADITION, THERE HAS ONLY BEEN 20 TIMES WHEN PHIL DID NOT SEE HIS SHADOW, MOST RECENTLY IN 2024. JUST LIKE CORNELIA, PHIL SAW HIS SHADOW, MARKING SIX MORE WEEKS OF WINTER.

Worcester Announces Permanent Winter Parking Ban in Effect Dec. 1 Through April 30



The City of Worcester announced Friday November 22, it's Permanent Winter Parking Ban will go into effect Dec. 1, 2024, and will remain through April 30, 2025 (April 1 for residential streets). The Permanent Winter Parking Ban applies to emergency arteries, WRTA bus routes, and streets that are critical to the flow of traffic. There is no parking on one or both sides of the affected street between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. nor any time a snow emergency is declared.

In addition to the Permanent Winter Parking Ban, a Declared Winter Parking Ban will go into effect on all other city streets whenever accumulating snow is forecast. When a declared ban is in effect, parking is allowed only on the odd-numbered side of other streets, unless posted otherwise, and municipal parking garages will be free to use until noted following the ban's lifting. Parking enforcement-including ticketing and towing-will be active during a Declared Ban, as adherence to parking bans is critical to allow municipal crews to keep roadways clear and safe.

Illegally parked vehicles are the biggest obstacle to effective snow removal efforts. Vehicles that violate the winter parking ban or otherwise hinder snow removal will be ticketed and towed at the owner's expense. Winter Parking Rules

Winter parking bans on public streets fall under two categories, PERMANENT and DECLARED.

- A PERMANENT BAN remains in effect from December 1st through April 30th on Emergency Arteries, WRTA Bus Routes, and streets that are critical to the flow of traffic. There is no parking on one or both sides of the street between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. and anytime a snow emergency is declared.
- A DECLARED BAN is put into effect on all remaining city streets whenever accumulating snow is forecast. When a Declared Ban is in effect, restrictions apply that typically allow parking on one side of the street.
