## **WORCESTER YOUTH CONVENTION - 4/24**

THE CITY OF WORCESTER YOUTH COUNCIL HOSTED A YOUTH CONVENTION ON THURSDAY, APRIL 24 AT DOHERTY MEMORIAL HIGH SCHOOL. THE EVENT WELCOMED WORCESTER YOUTH AGES 12-24 TO BUILD LEADERSHIP SKILLS AND NETWORK. CITY COUNCILORS JENNY PACILLO, KHRYSTIAN E. KING, AND ETEL HAXHIAJ ATTENDED A SPECIAL SECTION CALLED "MEET YOUR REPRESENTATIVES." DURING THIS PORTION, THE COUNCILORS SPLIT INTO SMALL GROUPS TO CHAT ONE-ON-ONE WITH PARTICIPANTS AND ANSWER THEIR QUESTIONS. 
## ARBOR DAY 2025

THE CITY OF WORCESTER DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS & PARKS (DPW&P) HOSTED AN ARBOR DAY CELEBRATION ON FRIDAY, APRIL 25, 2025, AT ELM PARK. THE CITY CELEBRATED ITS 39TH CONSECUTIVE TREE CITY USA DESIGNATION AND RECEIVED ITS 26TH CONSECUTIVE TREE CITY USA GROWTH AWARD. AS PART OF THE CELEBRATION, TWO AMERICAN ELM TREES AND ONE LONDON PLANE TREE WERE PLANTED. COUNCILOR PACILLO ATTENDED THE EVENT AND READ A PROCLAMATION ON BEHALF OF THE MAYOR. DPW&P, IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF SUSTAINABILITY AND RESILIENCE, PLANS TO PLANT 300 TO 400 TREES CITYWIDE THIS SPRING, FOCUSING ON ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE NEIGHBORHOODS. THE EVENT WAS COORDINATED WITH PARTNERS INCLUDING THE URBAN FORESTRY TREE COMMISSION, NEW ENGLAND BOTANIC GARDEN AT TOWER HILL, THE DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION AND RECREATION, THE USDA, THE GREEN WORCESTER ADVISORY COMMITTEE, THE GREATER WORCESTER LAND TRUST, AND NATIONAL GRID. THE ARBOR DAY CELEBRATION HIGHLIGHTED THE CITY'S ONGOING COMMITMENT TO URBAN FORESTRY AND ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP.

## **City of Worcester Spring Street Sweeping Has Begun!**



The City of Worcester Department of Public Works & Parks began residential street sweeping, Monday, April 7, 2025 in the section of the city that has trash/recycling collected on Tuesday, then progressed to the Friday, Thursday, Monday, and Wednesday trash collection areas. Sign have been posted in neighborhoods in advance of sweeping and will remain in place until the street has been swept.

Arterial streets are swept 11:30 p.m. - 7:30 a.m., Monday - Friday. Residential streets are swept 7:30 a.m. - 4 p.m. Monday - Friday.

Parking Bans will be in effect during street sweepings. Vehicles that interfere with street sweeping will be tagged and may be towed. There is a \$50 fine for cars that are not removed for the street sweeping.

**<u>REMINDER:</u>** Street Sweepers <u>cannot</u> pick up brush, branches, or yard waste. Residents are advised to bring these items to one of the <u>municipality's yard waste drop-off sites</u>. Violators are subject to fines. Residents and business owners can assist with cleanups by sweeping sidewalk sand and debris into the gutter before street sweepers come to the area. It is also greatly appreciated if residents can sweep in front of walkways, vacant lots, and medians.


Residential street sweeping will take approximately six to eight weeks to complete. Area mapping with anticipated upcoming dates for street sweeping can be found on the municipal website.

The Spring Street Sweeping schedule is subject to change. Worcester 311 will regularly post routes on social media. Residents can also sign up to receive updates from ALERTWorcester to receive critical community notifications.
