

GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY 204 MAIN ST - 5/30

TUESDAY, MAY 30TH CITY AND STATE OFFICIALS JOINED TOGETHER TO CELEBRATE A NEW INVESTMENT PROJECT. THE MENKITI GROUP HAS A NUMBER OF DIFFERENT HOUSING PROJECTS AROUND THE CITY AND THE 204 MAIN STREET LOCATION IS THE LATEST PROJECT TO BREAK GROUND. LOCATED IN THE HISTORIC KANE BUILDING ACROSS FROM THE WORCESTER COURT HOUSE, THIS LOCATION WILL HAVE UP TO 30 NEW HOUSING UNITS, REDVELOPING THE RETAIL SPACE ON MAIN STREET WHICH IS CURRENTLY HOME TO "GARDEN FRESH COURTHOUSE CAFE." STATE AND LOCAL OFFICIALS WORKED IN TANDEM TO SECURE MONIES TO HELP PUSH THIS PROJECT FORWARD. COMPLETION IS EXPECTED BY MID 2026.

HIS FAMILY AND FRIENDS GATHERED AT THE GREENDALE YMCA – A PLACE HARRIS VISITED DAILY TO HONE HIS BASKETBALL SKILLS – TO UNVEIL A STREET SIGN HONORING HIS NAME.

City of Worcester Spring Street Sweeping is Completed!



The City of Worcester Department of Public Works & Parks began residential street sweeping, Monday, April 7, 2025 in the section of the city that has trash/recycling collected on Tuesday, then progressed to the Friday, Thursday, Monday, and Wednesday trash collection areas. Sign have been posted in neighborhoods in advance of sweeping and will remain in place until the street has been swept.

Arterial streets are swept 11:30 p.m. - 7:30 a.m., Monday - Friday. Residential streets are swept 7:30 a.m. - 4 p.m. Monday - Friday.

Parking Bans will be in effect during street sweepings. Vehicles that interfere with street sweeping will be tagged and may be towed. There is a \$50 fine for cars that are not removed for the street sweeping.

<u>REMINDER</u>: Street Sweepers <u>cannot</u> pick up brush, branches, or yard waste. Residents are advised to bring these items to one of the <u>municipality's yard waste drop-off sites</u>. Violators are subject to fines. Residents and business owners can assist with cleanups by sweeping sidewalk sand and debris into the gutter before street sweepers come to the area. It is also greatly appreciated if residents can sweep in front of walkways, vacant lots, and medians.

Residential street sweeping will take approximately **six to eight weeks to complete**. <u>Area mapping with anticipated upcoming dates for street sweeping can be found on the municipal website</u>.

The Spring Street Sweeping schedule is subject to change. <u>Worcester 311</u> will regularly post routes on social media. Residents can also sign up to receive updates from <u>ALERTWorcester</u> to receive critical community notifications.
