ITEM 6A INFORMATIONAL COMMUNICATION RELATIVE TO THE ERNEST A. JOHNSON TUNNEL

THE WORCESTER CITY COUNCIL HEARD COMMUNICATION FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS (DPW) REGARDING THE CURRENT STATUS OF THE ERNEST A. JOHNSON TUNNEL. THE TUNNEL, OPENED IN 1956, IS A ONE-WAY TUNNEL RUNNING FROM MAIN STREET TO LINCOLN STREET IN AN ATTEMPT TO ALLEVIATE TRAFFIC AT LINCOLN SQUARE. THE TUNNEL HAS BEEN CLOSED SINCE 2023 AND THERE IS CURRENTLY A MULTI-HOUSING PROJECT BEING CONSTRUCTED DIRECTLY ABOVE THE TUNNEL. DPW BROUGHT FORWARD COMMUNICATION TO INFORM THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CURRENT CLOSURE OF THE TUNNEL AND HOW THE CONSTRUCTION PROJECT WILL HAVE TO INSPECT THE STRUCTURE OF THE TUNNEL TO CONTINUE THEIR PROJECT WORK.



INFORMATIONAL COMMUNICATION RELATIVE

THE DEPARTMENT OF EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS GAVE INFORMATIONAL COMMUNICATION REGARDING THE USE OF EMERGENCY WARMING AND COOLING CENTERS IN WORCESTER OVER THE LAST TWO YEARS. EMERGENCY WARMING AND COOLING CENTERS ARE ACTIVATED DURING EXTREME WEATHER EVENTS, USING CRITERIA DEVELOPED BETWEEN THE MUNICIPALITY AND ITS METEOROLOGISTS AND BASED UPON BEST PRACTICES FROM LIKE-SIZED CITIES. THE CITY OF WORCESTER HAS ACTIVATED WARMING AND COOLING CENTERS ON 18 OCCASIONS IN THE PAST TWO YEARS AT VARYING LOCATIONS TO MEET THE NEEDS OF OUR RESIDENTS DURING THOSE CHALLENGING WEATHER DAYS.

WHEELABRATOR PLANT TOUR- 7/17

DISTRICT 1 CITY COUNCILOR JENNY PACILLO WAS INVITED TO TOUR THE WHEELABRATOR TRASH PLANT IN MILLBURY WITH JOHN WESTERLING, COMMISSIONER OF THE WORCESTER DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS (DPW). THE WHEELABRATOR PLANT OPENED IN 1987 AND PRODUCES ENERGY-FROM-WASTE CAPABLE OF PRODUCING 45 MW OF ELECTRICITY – ENOUGH CLEAN, RENEWABLE ENERGY TO POWER 47,000 HOMES IN THE TOWN OF MILLBURY, WORCESTER, AND SURROUNDING CENTRAL MASSACHUSETTS COMMUNITIES AS WELL AS ITS OWN OPERATIONS. THE FACILITY USES UP TO 1,500 TONS OF EVERYDAY WASTE FROM HOMES AND BUSINESSES EACH DAY AS A LOCAL FUEL TO CREATE A LOCAL-ENERGY ECOSYSTEM THAT GENERATES RELIABLE, RENEWABLE ENERGY FOR THE LOCAL UTILITY. BY USING WASTE MATERIALS AS A FUEL TO PRODUCE ELECTRICITY, WE OFFER AN ENVIRONMENTALLY FRIENDLY WASTE DISPOSAL OPTION AND REDUCE DEPENDENCE ON LANDFILLS.

This park offers the region's first state-of-the-art, universally accessible, multigenerational park and playground. This park and playground is a place for all ages and abilities to exercise, play, enjoy nature and relax. Many of the other parks offer updated playgrounds, fields, water features, and endless opportunities to explore nature. The Parks Division is seeking seasonal lifeguards to join our team in keeping our community pools and beaches safe.
