

FRIENDLY HOUSE FAMILY SHELTER - 8/13

ON WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 13TH, FRIENDLY HOUSE OPENED THE DOORS OF ITS NEW FAMILY SHELTER, LOCATED AT 15 BIRCH STREET, FOR A NEIGHBORHOOD OPEN HOUSE. THE SHELTER WILL ACCOMMODATE UP TO 13 FAMILIES AT A TIME AND COMPLIES WITH STATE SHELTER GUIDELINES. ALLOWING FOR SIX-MONTH STAYS FOR FAMILIES IN NEED, DESPITE A POWER OUTAGE, THE EVENT WENT ON AS PLANNED, WITH MAYOR JOE PETTY AND SENATOR ROBYN KENNEDY OFFERING WORDS OF SUPPORT, FRIENDLY HOUSE HOPES TO OPEN THE SHELTER SOON, PENDING THE COMPLETION OF ALL SCHEDULED INSPECTIONS.

City Beaches, Pools, and Spray Parks

The City of Worcester has made significant investment into its parks, playgrounds, pools and beaches in recent years. A park of note is Coes Pond Park for its updated accessibility features. This park offers the region's first state-of-the-art, universally accessible, multigenerational park and playground. This park and playground is a place for all ages and abilities to exercise, play, enjoy nature and relax. Many of the other parks offer updated playgrounds, fields, water features, and endless opportunities to explore nature. The Parks Division is seeking seasonal lifeguards to join our team in keeping our community pools and beaches safe. The City of Worcester has one pool, three spray parks and four beaches. The City is also home to three state beaches and pools. All sites are normally open to the public from 12 to 7 p.m. every day beginning July 1.
