Please briefly describe your project.	Belmont AME Zion Church is 160 years old and is the oldest African American Church in Worcester. In 2008, we purchased Holy Name of Jesus Church, which is 110 years old today. The church is undergoing a Capital Campaign to assist with repairing our slate roof and interior. The condition of the slate has caused significant internal damage to our sanctuary walls, windows, ceilings, molding, and ornate columns. The interior damage has extended to our fellowship hall, where we run our Food Distribution and Community Essentials Program in partnership with Yes We Care, our 501c3 organization. Weekly, we distribute food and family essentials to 1,000 people in need, and we have distributed essential convenience supplies totaling over \$800,000 in 2024.

We need CPA funds to cover the majority of the project, as we do not have the ability to cover what is needed to complete the full scope of the roof project and internal work. The church has maintained repairs such as new gutters, completed a small section of the roof repair, and repointed some of the brick. We cannot fulfill a project of this magnitude, and that is why CPA funds would be a critical lifeline for our project.
Please describe the experience of the project manager or project management team in completing a project like this one. Altitude Roofing and Chester Marek, the Operations Manager, has relevant experience working with historical churches, particularly slate roofing repair. They worked on the Cathedral Residences Project at 34 Fenner Street in Providence, RI, the Presbyterian Church of Ghana, 10 Chestnut Street, Worcester, and the Kishibiy Resident Project at 6 Regent Street, Worcester. I've included a list of references in the appendix.
Please describe the financial position of the organization and its ability to cover the upfront costs of this project. CPA funding is provided on a reimbursement basis.	The church has a year-end balance of \$24K in balances. We cannot cover the upfront costs of the project. Altitude Roofing has agreed to invoice for repairs after each portion of the roof and interior has been completed on a 30-day post-completion basis. I have included a copy of our balance sheet for your review.

How will this resource/property/building be maintained in the future?	The church will enter into an annual maintenance agreement with Altitude Roofing for inspection and repair of any slate on an ongoing basis. We have not signed a contract at this time, but plan to as part of the project.
Please describe how this project/program will benefit Worcester residents in general, as well as specific groups that will benefit from the project.	The project will restore the church so that we can carry out our mission of supporting our community. Located in Main South, the church provides weekly assistance to 1,000 people in need with food and essential supplies. We provide hope for underserved, low to moderate-income families who experience food insecurity. We also offer essentials such as clothing, electronics, kitchen essentials, hygiene products, blankets, diapers, toys, and more. In 2024, we distributed over \$800K in supplies.

The project aligns with CPA because of the mission, vision, and history of the church and the impact of the church within the geographic area. Main South has a population of 15,212 residents. It is racially diverse with 40% Hispanic, 33% Caucasian, and 12% African American. Conversely, the median household income is \$40,277, below the national median of \$78,538. Through our outreach ministry, we provide food and family essentials and offer personal development programs for youth, such as the Ashton Langford Basketball Academy, where the focus is on leadership development, teamwork, and basketball acumen. We offer the Debutante Program, a six-month program, for girls ages 15-19 that teaches basic budgeting and banking, college planning, and career exploration. We also offer the Leaders in Committed Action Program for students who want to impact the community and the

Please describe how this project aligns with the above Category Goals.	By preserving the church, we're preserving the legacy and impact of two historic churches. Our church facility is one of four buildings that belonged to the Holy Name of Jesus Church. It included the church, rectory, school, and convent and served the South Worcester French Canadian community. The Sisters of Saint Anne ran the elementary school from 1898 until 1977. The church was designed in the Romanesque style with wide and expansive naves and transepts. Today, the church is the only structure that serves its intended purpose to be a spiritual and educational guide in the community. Belmont AME Zion Church, the oldest Black church in Worcester, was started on the premise of freedom. Its early supporters of the church over the years included Frederick Douglass, Coretta Scott King, and Mahalia Jackson. Members have been veterans, teachers, and prominent members of the community. All have made an impact and continue to add to the historic legacy of both churches.
