The preservation work needed to maintain this historic building is a major undertaking, and without the support of the Community Preservation Act funding, we would be unable to proceed with these necessary repairs and improvements.

The project will be managed internally by members of the Cultural Center Hrisohorafiton Alexander the Great, ensuring careful oversight and adherence to CPA requirements. Natalie Demers, member, will serve as the primary project coordinator, overseeing planning, scheduling, and historical commission compliance. She will be supported by George Yiantsidis, the current president of the Cultural Center and a City of Worcester local inspector, who brings extensive knowledge of building codes. George Vasiliadis, the current treasurer, will oversee financial management, ensuring that payments, reimbursements, and accounting are handled accurately and transparently.
Please describe the financial position of the organization and its ability to cover the upfront costs of this project. CPA funding is provided on a reimbursement basis.	<p>The Cultural Center Hrisohorafiton is in a stable financial position and is able to cover the initial upfront costs associated with this project. We have the capacity to make an upfront payment of \$10,000 at the start of construction using existing operating reserves and designated maintenance funds. In addition, the organization will actively work with the selected contractor to establish a payment schedule that aligns with the CPA reimbursement process.</p> <p>Under this approach, the initial payment will allow work to commence without delay. Upon completion of the eligible project milestones and receipt of CPA reimbursement, the organization will promptly apply reimbursed funds toward the next scheduled payment to the contractor. This phased payment strategy ensures that the project can move forward efficiently while maintaining the organization's financial stability.</p>
How will this resource/property/building be maintained in the future?	The organization will ensure long-term maintenance through financial planning and regular oversight. Pending approval from a general assembly, a dedicated sub-account will be established for building maintenance funds. A facilities committee will conduct annual building assessments, and an ongoing relationship with a qualified contractor will be maintained to address repairs promptly, helping prevent larger, more costly issues.

This project will benefit Worcester residents by preserving a historic community space used for cultural, educational, and social activities. The primary beneficiaries are organization members who gather in the space to build community and preserve cultural traditions. These members are immigrants or descendants of immigrants from the village of Hrisohorafa in Serres, Greece, and their continued presence contributes to Worcester's cultural heritage and community life.
