NGP is seeking to work with GWLT to create a natural dedication area and trail connection within The Reactory development. This dedication area is located on a 0.310 acre parcel that abuts an 11.2 acre parcel that is owned by GWLT and is in the process of being placed into a Conservation Restriction, providing greater protection for the East Side Trail and the surrounding trail connections. The proposed project would utilize the 0.310 parcel to create a dedication area to honor Dr. Dorista Goldsberry and other trailblazers that worked at the Worcester State Hospital. This dedication area will consist of natural plantings and reclaimed granite slabs to create a contemplative sitting area that provides visitors with the opportunity to enjoy the natural surroundings and learn about the groundbreaking work of Dr. Dorista Goldsberry and her colleagues. The project will also provide parking facilities and trailhead access to the 3.44 mile East Side Trail. NGP is in the process of finalizing the design for the dedication area

The proposed project includes the creation of a dedication area to honor the community contributions of Dr. Dorista Goldsberry and other community members. As part of this dedication area, the project will introduce a new trailhead to the East Side Trail in Worcester, creating new access to the eastern flank of the trail. The East Side Trail was constructed in 1997 and traverses 3.44 miles over 550 acres, beginning at Cristoforo Columbo Park on Shrewsbury Street and ending at Lake Quinsigamond. This project would introduce a new access point to this trail, seamlessly integrating into the surrounding paths and

The East Side Trail was created from the Green Hill Park Master Plan in 1997 and the City Open Space and Recreation Plan in 2021. Building on these, the proposed project aligns with the City of Worcester's Now Next plan (March, 2024), directly aligning with the theme of "ecosystem health, connectivity and access to nature." This project provides a unique opportunity to enhance an existing trail network and create new reflective space within a natural setting for residents and visitors alike.

This project has been in the planning stages since 2020 as part of the redevelopment efforts at the former Worcester State Hospital campus. Since that time, NGP has held a number of on-site meetings to discuss the dedication area concept and review designs with the community. This community-supported project reflects a shared vision to enhance the city's green space and create a space that honors members of the community, creating new connections, both physically and symbolically.
