CPA funding is needed for this project to enable this project to become fully funded and benefit a public park in Worcester. Friends of Institute Park, Inc., a 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization is a group of modest means, but has a 20-year track record of being a catalyst for positive change for Worcester's Institute Park. Our efforts have produced many improvements in this park through partnerships with the City of Worcester, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, the federal government, and WPI
Please describe the experience of the project manager or project management team in completing a project like this one. Although this project will be paid with funds flowing through Friends of Institute Park, Inc., the project manager for this project will be the City of Worcester Parks Department. As with all physical improvements that have been made to Institute Park, the Worcester Parks Department has vast experience in overseeing all such improvements. Worcester Parks has overseen similar projects at Green Hill Park, University Park, Great Brook Valley, Tacoma St. Playground, and others.
Please describe the financial position of the organization and its ability to cover the upfront costs of this project. CPA funding is provided on a reimbursement basis.	Friends of Institute Park, Inc. is fully committed to undertaking this project. The organization has a working fund that will be sufficient to cover the first invoice from the contractor. With reimbursement from the City for each expended payment, Friends will be able to cover each subsequent invoice.

The Worcester Parks Department, similar to all built improvements in Institute Park, will maintain the improvements that are the subject of this application.

Worcester residents use Institute Park daily for recreation, relaxing, viewing nature, cultural events, and even life cycle events such as wedding ceremonies occurring at Institute Park's gazebo. The proposed improvements will benefit (i) FOIP as it highlights the gazebo's amenities to host various events (ii) WPI as a place for informal outdoor classes for its students; and (iii) the Massachusetts Symphony's proposed jazz concert series.
