Clean and conserve 21 portraits (and frames) of historically significant individuals from the 19th century installed in the Great Hall and Washburn Lobby of Mechanics Hall. 17 portraits were installed between 1868 and the early 20th century and 4 were installed in 1999. All individuals are important to the history of Worcester.
-	The project does not require special permissions or permits. We have contracted the conservator, the fine art handler, and the wall repair and painter who will prep and repair wall spaces as the portraits are removed for conservation.

That project included commissioning 3 new portraits of 19th century Black Americans, preserving the older portraits, and creating programming. Additionally, the IMLS has committed \$22,900 for one year of the project.

Kelsey Miller, Deputy Director of Mechanics Hall is responsible for financial reporting and budgeting. He is a CPA and has been with MH since 2017. Tricia Shea, Facilities Director, has more than 35 years of facilities management and was project manager of the new portraits installation in 2024. Birgit Straehle, Conservator, was Conservator on staff at Worcester Art Museum for 20+ years and now has a private practice.

Please describe the financial its ability to cover the upfront costs of this project. CPA funding is provided on a reimbursement basis.

Mechanics Hall annual budget is \$2.3 million. In recent years, we position of the organization and have raised \$570,000 for the entire Portraits Project, including \$100,000 from the Commonwealth of MA. \$45,000 of that funding is targeted for portraits preservation. Additionally, we raised \$848,455 for phases I and II of the four-phase theatrical sound and lighting upgrades. Attached bank statement supports the available dollars we currently have for portraits preservation and programming.

How will this resource/property/building be maintained in the future?

Mechanics Hall was built in 1857. Major restoration/renovation took place in 1976-1978, 1982, 1991, 2000, 2013, 2016, 2019, 2024, and now 2025. The Conservator is using modern techniques and materials that promise decades of portraits' integrity. Ongoing portraits preservation is assured: Conservator Straehle will instruct staff how to keep portraits clean of dust and dirt, which will mitigate the need for major restoration in the future.

Please describe how this project/program will benefit Worcester residents in general, as well as specific groups that will benefit from the project.

All residents of the City of Worcester will benefit from the project, which preserves, in our world-class concert hall, an impressive visual art representation of Worcester's 19th century history that depicts industrialists, statesmen, social reformers, and Civil War heroes. The gallery offers a more complete Worcester history now that paintings of Black Americans of that time period were commissioned/installed in 2024, following the addition of women's portraits in 1999.

Mechanics Hall has been a beloved community gathering space for 168 years. All are welcome to attend and host events and that spirit of accessibility is evident in the wide variety of experiences that take place. Social, arts & culture, education, business, and community events all have a home in our Hall. As a result, more than 150,000 people patronize or perform in the Hall each year. Mechanics Hall is a testament to the skills and aspirations of the people of Worcester

	in the past and presently. Further, its beauty, history, and world- renown combine to offer inspiration for Worcester's future. The portraits are dominant visuals in the Great Hall and on the second level of building – seen by all who visit.

The paintings being preserved range in age from 157 years to 25 years. The oldest paintings were last cleaned and repaired in 1977 and all are in serious need of conservation. While some of the paintings could be considered fine art, all the paintings are "documentary" depictions of 19th century individuals who represent the values of the Worcester County Mechanics Association: industriousness, human well-being, justice, innovation, and patriotism. The portraits of women and other Black Americans align with Goal 4: Preserving underrepresented stories. The histories of American women and Blacks are not easily discovered yet are prominently honored in Mechanics Hall.

The entire Portraits Project had several parts: Commission and install portraits of Black Americans; conserve the historic portraits; create cultural and educational programming using the portraits as catalysts. We raised \$570,000 for the project, which included \$100,000 from the Commonwealth of MA. The rest was donated by individuals and businesses. We still require about \$71,000 – including this request of \$45,000 - to complete the preservation aspect of the project.

The complete Portraits Project description can be found at: https://mechanicshall.org/portraits-project/ The Mechanics Hall portrait gallery must be conserved just as well as we preserve and maintain other aspects of the building, Worcester's treasured National Historic Landmark. It is a 4-year process. The work conducted to date is fully funded.
