With reference to our bid request relative to the above subject, please refer to the changes/modifications/clarifications to the original proposal request.

PLEASE SEE BELOW QUESTIONS RECEIVED AND RESPONSES FROM CITY

What test panel do you need for steroid testing? Anabolic Steroids panel

Who is your current TPA/administrator for this contract, and what SAMHSA lab are your currently testing through? TPA is Arcpoint Labs of Worcester. SAMSHA lab is Quest Diagnostics.

What walk-in clinics do you currently use, and are the sites suffice for the Town's needs? The City primarily uses Arcpoint Lab, Grove Street, Worcester. The City also uses Quest Diagnostic labs located throughout the City and neighboring communities. These sites are sufficient.

What mobile collector do you use for onsite testing needs? Arcpoint Labs of Worcester

Why the requirement for Nicotine testing? Is the City looking for a standalone nicotine testing panel, or for nicotine to be tested in combination with a NonDOT drug test panel? This is a statutory requirement for certain City positions. Nicotine is done as a stand alone test.

The bid is requesting the need for testing after normal hours. However, unless using a walk-in clinic open in the evenings and on weekend, this might require onsite testing by a mobile collector. Where can we indicate onsite collection rates, which are often different than walk-in collection rates? The City does not presently pay a separate rate for onsite or walk-in. Bidders may not add items or other fees to this bid.

On page 11, the bid references that supplier shall retain the split specimen for at least 60 days. For positives, this is a mute point. For negatives, labs typically only keep specimens for up to 7-10 days before discarding. Can you please clarify what the City is referring to in this statement? Presently, for a negative result, the lab holds on to the specimen for 10 days to 2 weeks. For a positive test, the sample is retained for one year.

Would you like pricing for additional DOT required services, such as FMCSA Clearinghouse Query submissions, DOT Physicals, "Reasonable Suspicion" training for Supervisors, or MVRs/Background checks? The City does not wish to receive pricing for these.

Would the City be interested in utilizing the electronic chain of custody form, over paper forms, whenever possible? The City already does this.

How & where will answers to these questions be posted/released to prospective bidders? We will post an addendum on the bid page with Q & A from bidders.

Would the City like any additional copies of our proposal, in addition to our original proposal, sent with our submission? No, additional copies not needed

Bidders are requested to acknowledge and/or include this addendum with submission. All other terms, conditions and specifications remain unchanged.
