This contract may be renewed for a second and third year at the sole discretion of the City, the option of which will be determined toward the end of the current contract year.

- 8. The following meanings are attached to the defined words when used in this bid form.
 - (a) The word "City" means The City of Worcester, Massachusetts.
 - (b) The word "Bidder" means the person, firm or corporation submitting a bid on these specifications or any part thereof.
 - (c) The word "Contractor" means the person, firm or corporation with whom the contract is made by carrying out the provisions of these specifications and the contract.
 - (d) The words "Firm Price" shall mean a guarantee against price increases during the life of the contract.
- 9. Any prospective bidder requesting a change in or interpretation of existing specifications of terms and conditions must do so within five (5) days (Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays excluded) BEFORE scheduled bid opening date. All requests are to be in writing to the Purchasing Division (or e-mailed at: gagliastroc@worcesterma.gov). No changes will be considered or any interpretation issued unless the request is in our hands within five (5) days (Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays excluded) BEFORE scheduled bid opening date.
- 10. The contractor will be required to indemnify and save harmless the City of Worcester, for all damages to life and property that may occur due to his negligence or that of his employees, subcontractors, etc., during this contract.
- 11. The Contract Agreement will be in the form customarily employed by the City of Worcester and is on file in the Purchasing Division at City Hall.
- 12. Bids which are incomplete, not properly endorsed, or signed, or otherwise contrary to these instructions will be rejected as informal by the Purchasing Agent. **Conditional bids will not be accepted.**
- 13. The Bidder must certify that no official or employee of the City of Worcester, Massachusetts is pecuniarily interested in this proposal or in the contract which the bidder offers to execute or in expected profits to arise therefrom, unless there has been compliance with provisions of G.L. C. 43 Sec. 27, and that this bid is made in good faith without fraud or collusion or connection with any other person submitting a proposal.
- 14. As the City of Worcester is exempt from the payment of Federal Excise Taxes and Massachusetts Sales Tax, prices quoted herein are not to include these taxes.
- 15. All prices are to be firm F.O.B. Destination, City of Worcester, Massachusetts, unless otherwise indicated by the City. **Time reserved for award is ninety days.**
- 16. In case of error in the extension prices quoted herein, the unit price will govern.
- 17. It is understood and agreed that should any price reductions occur between the opening of this bid and delivery of any order, the benefit of all such reductions will be extended to the City.
- 18. The City of Worcester reserves the right to reject any and all bids, wholly or in part, and to make awards in a manner deemed in the best interest of the City.
- 19. Awards will be made to the bidder quoting the lowest net price in accordance with the specifications.
- 20. The supplier will be bound by all applicable statutory provisions of law of the Federal Government, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, the City of Worcester, and the Department of Public Safety of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.
- 21. Any bid withdrawn after time and date specified, the bidder shall forfeit deposit on bid as liquidated damages.
- 22. The contractor will not be permitted to either assign, or underlet the contract, not assign either legally or equitably any monies hereunder, or its claim thereto without the previous written consent of the City Treasurer and of the Purchasing Agent of the City of Worcester.
- 23. If this bid shall be accepted by the City, and the bidder shall fail to contract as aforesaid and to give a bond in the amount as specified in Section 4, within ten (10) days, (not including Sunday or a legal Holiday) from the date of the mailing of a notice from the City to him/her, according to the address given herewith, that the contract is ready for signature, the City may by option determine that the bidder has abandoned the contract and thereupon the proposal and acceptance shall be null and void and the bid security accompanying this proposal shall become the property of the City as liquidated damages.

- 24. When quoting, the bidder shall submit a signed copy of this bid form, and if bid accepted by the City shall constitute part of the contract of purchase. Do not detach any part of this form 30B (Sealed Bid Goods & Services) when submitting a bid. Bidder must sign and return complete form 30B (Sealed Bid Goods & Services).
- 25. If in the judgment of the Purchasing Agent any property is needlessly damaged by an act or omission of the contractor or his/her employees, servants or agent, the amount of such damages shall be determined by the Purchasing Agent of the City of Worcester and such amount shall be deducted from any money due the contractor or may be recovered from said contractor in actions at law.
- 26. It is agreed that deliveries and/or completion are subject to strikes, lockouts, accidents and/or Acts of God.

INSURANCE AND WORKER'S COMPENSATION

- 27. <u>COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY INSURANCE:</u> Contractor to supply the City of Worcester with certificates of insurance evidencing general liability coverage of not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence / \$2,000,000.00 aggregate.
- 28. <u>AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY INSURANCE:</u> Contractor to supply the City of Worcester with certificates of insurance evidencing automobile liability coverage, bodily injury and property damage combined single limit, of \$ 1,000,000.00 (all owned, hired, and non-owned autos).
- 29. <u>COMPENSATION INSURANCE:</u> The contractor shall furnish the City of Worcester with certificates showing that all of his/her employees who shall be connected with this work are protected under Massachusetts' statutory worker's compensation insurance policies.
- 30. The Contractor shall carry public liability insurance with an insurance company satisfactory to the City so as to save the City harmless from any and all claims for damages arising out of bodily injury to or death of any person or persons, and for all claims for damages arising our of injury to or destruction of property caused by accident resulting from the use of implements, equipment or labor used in the performance of the contractor or from any neglect, default or omission, or want of proper care, or misconduct on the part of the Contractor or for anyone of his employ during the execution of the contract.
- 31. Prior to starting on this contract, the Contractor shall deposit with the Contracting Officer certificates from the insurer to the effect that the insurance policies required in the above paragraphs have been issued to the Contractor. The certificates must be on a form satisfactory to the Purchasing Agent.
- 32. Except as may otherwise be stated herein, the Contractor shall also carry bodily injury and property damage insurance in an amount not less than those set forth above covering the operation of all motor powered vehicles owned or operated by the Contractor and engaged in this contract.

DISCOUNT

- 33. Prompt pay discounts will be considered when determining the low bid except when discounts are for a period of less than 30 days. In this event discounts will not be taken into consideration when determining low bid.
- 34. Time, in connection with discount offered, will be computed from date of completion and/or delivery and acceptance at destination, or from date correct bill or voucher properly certified by the contract is received if the latter date is later than the date of completion and acceptance and/or delivery and acceptance.

GUARANTEE

35. The bidder to who a contract is awarded guarantees to the City of Worcester all equipment, materials and or workmanship for a period of one (1) year after final inspection and acceptance and shall replace promptly any defective equipment, materials and/or workmanship required without additional cost to the City.

DELIVERIES AND COMPLETION

- 36. It is understood and agreed that in the event of failure on the part of the bidder to indicate date of delivery and/or completion, delivery and/or completion will be made within twelve (12) days from date of notification. Should the successful bidder fail to make delivery or complete contract within time specified, the City reserves the right to make the purchase on such orders at the open market and charge any excess over contract price to the account of the successful bidder, who shall pay the same.
- 37. The contractor shall familiarize himself with the location and facilities for storage.
- 38. The City through its Purchasing Division reserves the right to divert delivery from one location to another, and to allow for any change in operating conditions or for any other cause not now foreseen and to proportion deliveries according to available storage facilities.

SAMPLING AND ANALYSIS

- 39. Each bidder must state the commercial name of the product quoted, name, and address of operator or agent from whom the product will be purchased and in addition shall furnish an analysis of the product, date of analysis, by whom made and their address.
- 40. Samples of the product to be delivered may be taken by a representative of the City, either prior to delivery or while it is being delivered in the storage facilities at destination, or will be taken from the storage facilities to which the product has been delivered as determined from time to time by the Purchasing Agent. Bidder agrees to furnish the necessary manual labor, without additional cost required to assemble the physical samples, which is to be performed under the direction of the City representative.
- 41. The representative of the City taking the samples shall be given the opportunity, while sampling, to affix his or her signature to the delivery slip each item represented in his/her sample.
- 42. Any product after the sampling and analysis, not found meeting the requirements of the contract shall be sufficient cause for the cancellation of the contract at the option of the Purchasing Agent.
- 43. If any product is found that does not meet the analysis submitted by the bidder in his/her proposal, the Purchasing Agent may, at his or her option, exercise his/her right to reject the product and require that all or any part thereof shall be removed promptly by and at the expense of the contractor and replace it forthwith with a product satisfactory to the Purchasing Agent, or to retain the product and compensate the contractor in an amount as determined by the Purchasing Agent and the City Manager.
- 44. It is understood and agreed that it shall be a material breach of any contract resulting from this bid for the Contractor to engage in any practice which shall violate any provisions of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 151B, relative to discrimination in hiring, discharge, compensation, or terms, conditions or privileges of employment because of race, color, religious creed, national origin, sex, age or ancestry.
- 45. The undersigned as bidder, declares that the only parties interested in this proposal as principals are named herein; that this proposal is made without collusion with any other person, firm or corporation, that no officer or agent of the City is directly or indirectly interested in this bid; and he/she proposes and agrees that if this proposal is accepted he/she will contract with the City in accordance with the specifications, also the terms and conditions as spelled out in this bid form.
- 46. No Person, including but not limited to corporations, partnerships, limited partnerships or limited liability corporations, shall be eligible to receive a contract under this invitation to bid and/or requires for proposal if that person has been convicted of any felony offense involving the distribution of controlled substances as that term is defined under Chapter 94C of the General Laws and, for contracts to be performed for on-site services to the Worcester Public Schools, if that person or any person to be employed by that person in the performance of such on-site services has been convicted of a "sex offense" or a "sex offense involving a child" or a "sexually violent offense" or would meet the definition of "sexually violent predator" as those terms are defined in Section 178C of the General Laws and who must register with the sex offender registry board.

- 47. The Contractor shall at all times enforce strict discipline and good order among his employees and shall not employ for work or services relating to this contract any unfit person or anyone not skilled in the task assigned to him. In light of the fact that the performance of this contract requires the Contractor and its employees to have significant interaction with the public, the Contractor shall require all employees who may perform services under this contract to conduct themselves in a courteous, professional manner. If the Contractor is notified by the Contract Officer that any person engaged upon the work is incompetent, unfaithful, disorderly, discourteous, or otherwise unsatisfactory, then such person shall be discharged from providing services or work pursuant to this contract. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, intimidation, threats and/or violent conduct of any kind or nature directed to members of the public are absolutely prohibited. Failure to comply with this requirement shall be grounds for termination of the contract.
- 48. The Contractor's performance may be evaluated on an ongoing basis including but not limited to consideration of complaints received from members of the public. In order to facilitate this evaluation, the Contractor shall provide the City with documents and records upon request. The Contractor shall further obtain from its employees authorization that appropriate City personnel may obtain all available criminal offender information ("CORI") from the Criminal History Systems Board. A high number of unresolved complaints, any number of complaints that are particularly severe, or employment of individuals who have been convicted or assault or other violent crimes shall be grounds for the early termination or non-renewal of the contract by the City.
- 49. The procurement officer shall award the contract to the lowest responsible and responsive bidder. The term "responsible bidder" means "a person who has the capability to perform fully the contract requirements, and the integrity and reliability which assures good faith performance." Consistent with its duty to maintain public order and promote public safety, the City has determined that this contract is of a type and nature so as to be particularly sensitive due, at least in part, to the contractor's inherent access and dealings with the members of the general public. Therefore, the City has concluded that additional scrutiny is justified as it determines whether a particular bidder is responsible, having the integrity and reliability to properly perform the requested services. This may entail consideration of the contractor's system of oversight, training and supervision of its employees, including but not limited to its requirement of a high standard of customer service and courtesy in its dealings with the public. The bidder's care and diligence in hiring and assigning its employees will also be considered. In making its determination, the City reserves the right to examine any and all information at its disposal, including but not limited to prior City contracts, the experiences and information obtained from current and former customers (whether identified by the bidder as references or not), as well as other sources available to the City, including but not limited to court documents, newspapers, financial reports (such as DUNS), and certain police data and reports.
- 50. The Contractor, acting through its owner(s) or any of its employees, or its agents or sub-contractors and any of their employees, shall not engage in any behavior, whether during the course of its duties under this contract or at any other time, that is illegal, criminal or otherwise shocking or offensive to the general public. The determination whether any particular behavior is illegal, criminal or shocking to the general public shall rest in the sound judgment of the Contracting Officer or the City Manager. In making such determination, the Contracting Officer or the City Manager shall apply the general standards of the community. No criminal conviction or formal charges shall be required to make such determination. Such behavior need be something more than trivial and something which would cause the general public to have concerns either about the safety of individuals coming in contact with the Contractor or about the character and integrity of the individuals with which the City does business. Violation of this provision shall be grounds for immediate and unilateral termination of this contract by the City upon five days' notice as otherwise provided herein.

- a. The contractor will be able to repair/weld/mechanically join or by some other means, all metal components at all schools and for all equipment. These repairs include but are not limited to, stick welding, gas welding, brazing, TiG, MiG, cutting, etc. The contract will be able to fabricate metal parts on an as need basis.
- b. NO WORK will be performed or approved for payment before the generation of a City of Worcester purchase order.
- c. The contractor will only repair what he is instructed to repair.
- d. The contractor shall contact the Worcester Public Schools Facilities Department (contact info provided in this bid) for clarification before proceeding on any repair that is questionable. No payment will be made for any work performed by the contractor outside the scope of the City of Worcester purchase order.
- e. The contractor must have all licenses applicable to the above work.
- f. The contractor must provide all tools and equipment necessary to perform the work as specified.
- g. Estimates, on request, must be provided in writing and free of charge.
- h. NO WORK will be considered complete or paid until tested and declared safe and in full operating order by the Worcester Public Schools Facilities department.
- i. No mileage costs or travel fee of any kind will be considered in the performance of this contract.

SPECIFICATIONS – WELDING & METAL FABRICATION SERVICES / WPS BID #: CR-8335-W5

The work to be performed under this specification shall include the furnishing of all labor, materials, equipment, and supervision necessary for all welding requirements (non-boiler) for all buildings operated by the Worcester School Department. City Departments may also use this contract as-needed. Price for service shall be the same for all departments / divisions. The contractor is required to quote an hourly rate and an overtime rate for emergency services. Service shall provide 24 hours per day, 365 days per year. All repair work will be on an as-needed basis.

It will be required that all calls for service be returned within one hour. It will be required that all emergency service repair work must commence within one hour of receiving a request for services by the School Department when a call is made between 7 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday through Friday.

For calls made by the School Department for service during any other hours/days, all calls must be returned within one hour after receiving the call from the School Department. The emergency service repair work must commence within two hours.

This service must be provided on a 24-hour per day 7-days a week basis. If the contractor fails to respond in the required time period, this may be grounds for cancellation of this contract.

SCOPE OF WORK

The work to be performed under this specification shall include the furnishing of all labor, materials, equipment and supervision necessary for the servicing of all Worcester Public Schools with regard to weld repair and metal fabrications.

TYPE OF REPAIR JOBS

It will be expected that the contractor be able to repair/weld/mechanically join or by some other means all metal components to all schools and the equipment, inside and outside. The contractor shall also fabricate metal parts on an as-needed basis. Repairs will include stick welding, gas welding, brazing, TiG, MiG, cutting, etc.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

All work shall comply in every respect with the Building Laws, City Regulations, Code Requirements (either city, state, or national) and the requirements of the Massachusetts Department of Public Safety.

The contractor shall obtain and pay for all permits, licenses, etc. as may be necessary or required for the completion of the work.

All equipment, materials, etc. specified to be removed from the site shall become the property of the contractor, unless otherwise stated.

All repair work will be left in safe and workable condition.

Contractor shall ONLY repair what he is instructed to repair.

If there are any questions regarding the repair work that is to be done, it will be the responsibility of the contractor to contact the School Facilities Department and request clarifications before proceeding.

No single job shall exceed \$10,000.00 under the terms of this contract.

It will be required that the tradesperson diagnose the problem and make the necessary repairs as soon as possible.

The worker must work as quickly and efficiently as possible. All repairs are to be of first quality.

The awarding authority reserves the right to terminate the contract at once if it appears that any job is not being performed as expeditiously as possible.

By executing this contract, the contractor represents that he has familiarized himself with the local conditions under which the work is to be performed.

In the event of accidental site damage, it will be the responsibility of the contractor to return the site to its original condition at no cost to the City of Worcester.

If temporary repairs are needed due to an emergency, the tradesperson is instructed to do so at the discretion of the School Facilities Manager or his designee. All permanent repairs must be made as soon as is possible. This must be done within a minimum of five (5) days after the problem has been diagnosed and approval to proceed has been given.

It will be the responsibility of the worker to leave the area in a clean, "broom swept" state. Worker must remove all debris generated while making repairs.

All defective parts that were replaced must be left with the Senior Custodian of the building.

DESCRIPTION OF WORK

The contractor shall be an experienced welder and metal fabrication repair person. It will be expected that the contractor repair any damaged metal components of a building or its equipment. Size of the repair will vary as well as metal thickness. The repair work would include but is not limited to sheet metal, fences, gates, doors, non-pressurized sections of boilers, furniture, playground equipment, piping, tanks, outside grounds equipment, trucks, plows, etc. All repair work will be properly cleaned before work is to begin. All welding is to be done according to existing practices. Proper techniques should also be used. After work has been completed, the surface shall be cleaned and scraped of any flux or other debris and painted as necessary so as to prevent corrosion. When feasible, all work will be done on School Department property.

It will also be expected that the welder fabricate metal parts at the discretion of the School Department. These parts would include hinges/gates on fences, parts for custodial and ground crew equipment, parts for plows, etc.

The contractor shall be totally familiar with all known types of metal repair techniques and metal fabrication. This would include but is not limited to gas metal ARC welding, TiG welding, brazing, stick welding, gas welding, metal cutting, etc. The contractor shall also be responsible for cutting any miscellaneous metal with either a torch or by some other mechanical means.

IT WILL BE THE UPMOST IMPORTANCE THAT THE TRADESPERSON WORK AS QUICKLY AND EFFICIENTLY AS POSSIBLE. THE SCHOOL BUILDING MUST REMAIN OPEN AND READY FOR CLASSES. THE TRADESPERSON MUST WORK ON THE JOB UNTIL THE CONDITION HAS BEEN CORRECTED – EITHER TEMPORARILY OR PERMANENTLY.

MATERIALS/SUPPLIES

It will be the requirement of the contractor to provide all the tools and equipment needed to do the job. The worker must bring the proper and basic tools and supplies as is applicable with him/her when he/she first visits the site. The City of Worcester shall not be charged for the use of the equipment that the contractor may need to complete a job. The City of Worcester shall not be responsible for any of the worker's equipment that is lost, stolen or damaged.

WARRANTIES/ GUARANTEES

All labor shall be guaranteed for a period of time not less than one year. There shall be a warranty for all materials used. This warranty shall be a manufacturer's warranty. If a part fails within the manufacturer's warranty time frame then it will be up to the vendor to replace this part free of charge.

ESTIMATES

It will be required the contractor provide the School Department with a free written estimate of work to be performed. The site must be visited and the estimate emailed to Kevin Peloquin <u>peloquink@worcesterschools.net</u> no later than, 48 hours after service call.

The estimate must contain:

School name and address

Total cost (labor and materials)

Breakdown of costs (labor - # of repair persons, # of hours) (materials – types and amounts)

Special equipment needed

Other special conditions

Specify exactly what work is to be done

Number of days to complete job

Start date ARO

Start date, for **NON-EMERGENCIES**, must be no later than 5 days ARO, unless specifically authorized by Worcester Public Schools

If the proposal is accepted, the work shall be done on time and the materials not to exceed the quoted price. Actual service slips will be needed with the final invoice.

SERVICE SLIPS

It will be required that every time a service person enters a building to do work a service slip/work order must be filled out describing the work. The slip must include but is not limited to the following information:

- Company's Name
- Address
- Telephone #
- Worker's Complete Name

Specify exactly what work was performed. Give details about the motor and its related characteristics as is possible.

Specify exactly where the work was performed in the school. Give panel numbers or room numbers as is appropriate.

Specify any and all materials that were used and the amounts that were used. Also specify the manufacturer, type, model number and any other pertinent information about the material(s) used.

Specify the cause of the failure in the first place – note any outstanding items/problems that still exist.

Specify the starting time and the completion time of the work that was performed along with the date on which it was done.

Specify the exact number of hours/minutes the tradesperson was on site while working on the problem.

Specify if the worker plans on returning to complete the work by the next day / week.

Specify as a suggestion any extra work that may be needed in the near future to insure proper operation or maintenance.

IT WILL BE REQUIRED THAT THIS SLIP BE SIGNED BY THE CUSTODIAN OF THE BUILDING. NO OTHER PERSONS SIGNATURE WILL BE ACCEPTED. THE ORIGINAL MUST BE LEFT WITH THE CUSTODIAN ON SITE. A COPY OF THE SLIP MUST BE SENT WITH THE INVOICE. IF THE SLIP IS NOT SIGNED BY THE CUSTODIAN THIS WILL BE GROUNDS FOR NON-PAYMENT OF THAT NOTICE.

THE TRADESPERSON MUST HAVE THE FOLLOWING ON SITE:

- Adequately sized vehicle to carry equipment, tools and supplies
- Tools: grinder, drills, wrenches, saws, hammers, etc.
- Completely portable (oxyacetylene) tanks for welding and cutting
- Electric Welder AC/DC minimum size 350 amps
- Welding/orezing rods to repair all steel, iron, etc.
- Spare metal stock such as angle iron, steel plate, re-bar, etc.
- Spray paint silver, black, red, white
- Ladders and staging
- Portable lights
- Fire extinguisher(s)

The worker shall obtain any supplies needed to complete the job at the most expeditious and cost effective location to the site. Another factor in determining where the supply shall be obtained will be the availability of the supply. **The Worcester Public School Department cannot be charged in excess of 10% over the contractor's net cost for material.** The City of Worcester pays no sales tax therefore the net cost must reflect this.

The contractor may use the site's existing services if they are available in order to complete a job. This would include water and electricity. This may be withdrawn if it is determined by the School Department that the contractor is abusing the privilege. The contractor may be charged for the use of the services if it is determined that the contractor is abusing the privilege.

COMPLETED WORK

All work must be completed and tested. It must be left in full operating order. It must be left in a safe condition where no harm can come to any person because of a lack of ordinary care. Its operation or condition must be tested in the presence of a custodian. It will be the responsibility of the worker to test the operation of the equipment/repair or prove the work was successfully completed in the presence of a custodian. This must be noted on the order/service slip. The custodian will sign this slip.

CORRECTIONS TO WORK

If the School Department, at its sole discretion, feels that the work performed by the vendor is not adequate then the City of Worcester will notify the vendor of this in writing. The vendor will have 5 business days to respond and make the necessary corrections. If the vendor fails to do this it will be grounds for cancellation of this contract. The City of Worcester may remedy the problem by hiring an outside vendor to complete/correct the job. The contracting vendor may be charged for these corrective services. If the contractor fails to correct defective work or persistently fails to carry out the work in accordance with the contract documents, the City of Worcester will cause this contract to be cancelled.

INVOICES

No invoices will be paid without the proper information attached. It will be required that all invoices be prepared in the following manner:

All invoices will be emailed to wpsacctspayable@worcesterschools.net

The copy of the service slip must accompany the invoice.

The School Department can only be invoiced after all the work has been completed.

All pertinent information must be broken out on the invoice as below:

- Number of hours worked (multiply this by the hourly rate)
- Any and all materials used for the job with their individual prices

• Brief description of work that was done

If the contracting vendor uses materials or services from an outside vendor, the invoice must state the cost for those items to the contracting vendor (not to exceed 10% over the contractor's net cost).

The invoice must be dated properly and accurately.

NO payment will be made until, such time, as the Worcester Public Schools is satisfied with work.

OVERCHARGING (MATERIALS)

If the City of Worcester and/or the Worcester School Department questions the validity of an invoice, the vendor will be notified. The vendor will have 5 business days to answer any and all questions and to provide proof of such items as:

(For materials/outside services)

Copy of invoice stating amount that the vendor was charged for supplies/services, etc. Invoice must be a legitimate copy to be forwarded to the School Department.

The invoice must be dated.

The invoice must have the company's name, address and telephone number along with a contact person's name.

The City and/or School Department may request from the contracting vendor a copy of any invoice from the company with which the vendor conducts his business for materials. The purpose of this is to confirm the contractor's net charge to the City of Worcester at a rate not to exceed 10% over the contractor's net cost.

The City reserves the right to conduct random price audits at its discretion.

PERSONNEL

No job will have more than one person working at a time unless explicit permission is received by the School Department. If the contractor sends more than one person it will be at their own discretion and cost.

MILEAGE

The School Department cannot be charged for any time, mileage fees or other costs while a tradesperson is traveling to and from the site. The vendor shall take into account this cost in his hourly rate when he bids. Time begins when the tradesperson arrives at the site. The School Department can be charged an amount based solely on the quoted hourly rate for picking up any parts or supplies needed in order to correct the problem.

CUSTODIAL COVERAGE

Normal school operation hours vary from school to school. However, typically the hours for custodial coverage for an elementary school at 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. High schools and middle school hours are from 6 a.m. to 11 p.m. Monday through Friday. Some custodial coverage is provided at certain schools on Saturdays. During vacation periods, the normal hours of operation would be 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday. Please contact the School Facilities Department to verify the hours and any vacation periods where the school might not be open.

MANDATORY MEETING

Under the terms of this contract it will be required that a representative from the company meet with school officials after the contract has been signed and approved in order to discuss procedures for service, the terms of the contract and any other questions either party may have. This will be considered an introductory meeting.

The contractor shall make no plans to repair any item in any school without a City of Worcester purchase order.

For construction projects lasting longer than one year, awarding authorities must request an updated wage schedule no later than two weeks before the anniversary of the date the contract was executed by the awarding authority and the general contractor. For multi-year CM AT RISK projects, the awarding authority must request an annual update no later than two weeks before the anniversary date, determined as the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the execution date of the first amendment to permit procurement of construction services. The updated wage schedule must be provided to all contractors, including general and sub-contractors, working on the construction project.
- This annual update requirement is generally not applicable to 27F "rental of equipment" contracts. For such contracts, the prevailing wage rates issued by DLS shall remain in effect for the duration of the contract term. However, if the prevailing wage rate sheet issued does not contain wage rates for each year covered by the contract term, the Awarding Authority must request updated rate sheets from DLS and provide them to the contractor to ensure the correct rates are being paid throughout the duration of the contract. Additionally, if an Awarding Authority exercises an option to renew or extend the contract term, they must request updated rate sheets form DLS and provide them to the contractor.
- This wage schedule applies only to the specific project referenced at the top of this page and uniquely identified by the "Wage Request Number" on all pages of this schedule.
- An Awarding Authority must request an updated wage schedule if it has not opened bids or selected a contractor within 90 days of the date of issuance of the wage schedule. For CM AT RISK projects (bid pursuant to G.L. c.149A), the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the bid for the first construction scope of work must be within 90-days of the wage schedule issuance date.
- The wage schedule shall be incorporated in any advertisement or call for bids for the project as required by M.G.L. c. 149, § 27. The wage schedule shall be made a part of the contract awarded for the project. The wage schedule must be posted in a conspicuous place at the work site for the life of the project in accordance with M.G.L. c. 149 § 27. The wages listed on the wage schedule must be paid to employees performing construction work on the project whether they are employed by the prime contractor, a filed sub-bidder, or a sub-contractor.
- Apprentices working on the project are required to be registered with the Massachusetts Division of Apprentice Standards (DAS). Apprentices must keep their apprentice identification card on their persons during all work hours on the project. An apprentice registered with DAS may be paid the lower apprentice wage rate at the applicable step as provided on the prevailing wage schedule. Any apprentice not registered with DAS regardless of whether they are registered with another federal, state, local, or private agency must be paid the journeyworker's rate.
- Every contractor or subcontractor working on the construction project must submit weekly payroll reports and a Statement of Compliance directly to the awarding authority by mail or email and keep them on file for three years. Each weekly payroll report must contain: the employee's name, address, occupational classification, hours worked, and wages paid. Do not submit weekly payroll reports to DLS. For a sample payroll reporting form go to http://www.mass.gov/dols/pw.
- Contractors with questions about the wage rates or classifications included on the wage schedule have an affirmative obligation to inquire with DLS at (617) 626-6953
- Contractors must obtain the wage schedules from awarding authorities. Failure of a contractor or subcontractor to pay the prevailing wage rates listed on the wage schedule to all employees who perform construction work on the project is a violation of the law and subjects the contractor or subcontractor to civil and criminal penalties.
