Corridor & Intersection Studies

- Completed Studies: Stafford St, Burncoat St and Grove St
- 750 ft of new sidewalk on Burncoat St by QCC

Complete ADA Transition Plan for the Right-of-Way

- Completed ADA self-evaluation inventory of sidewalks and ramps
- Presented to the Accessibility Advisory Commission
- Improved safety at crossings:
 - Installed 22 new RRFs
 - Painted 14 new crosswalks
 - Installed 13 new curb extensions

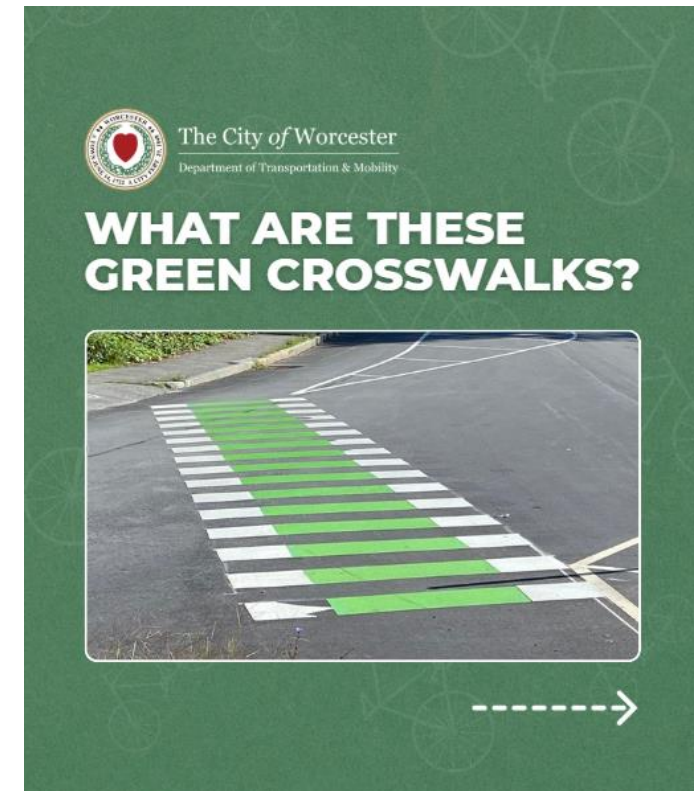
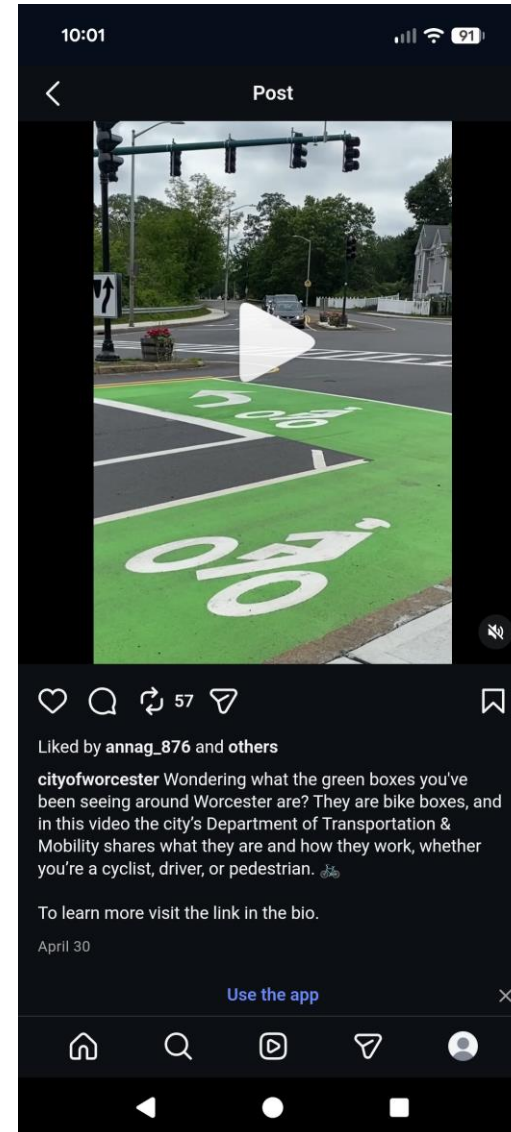

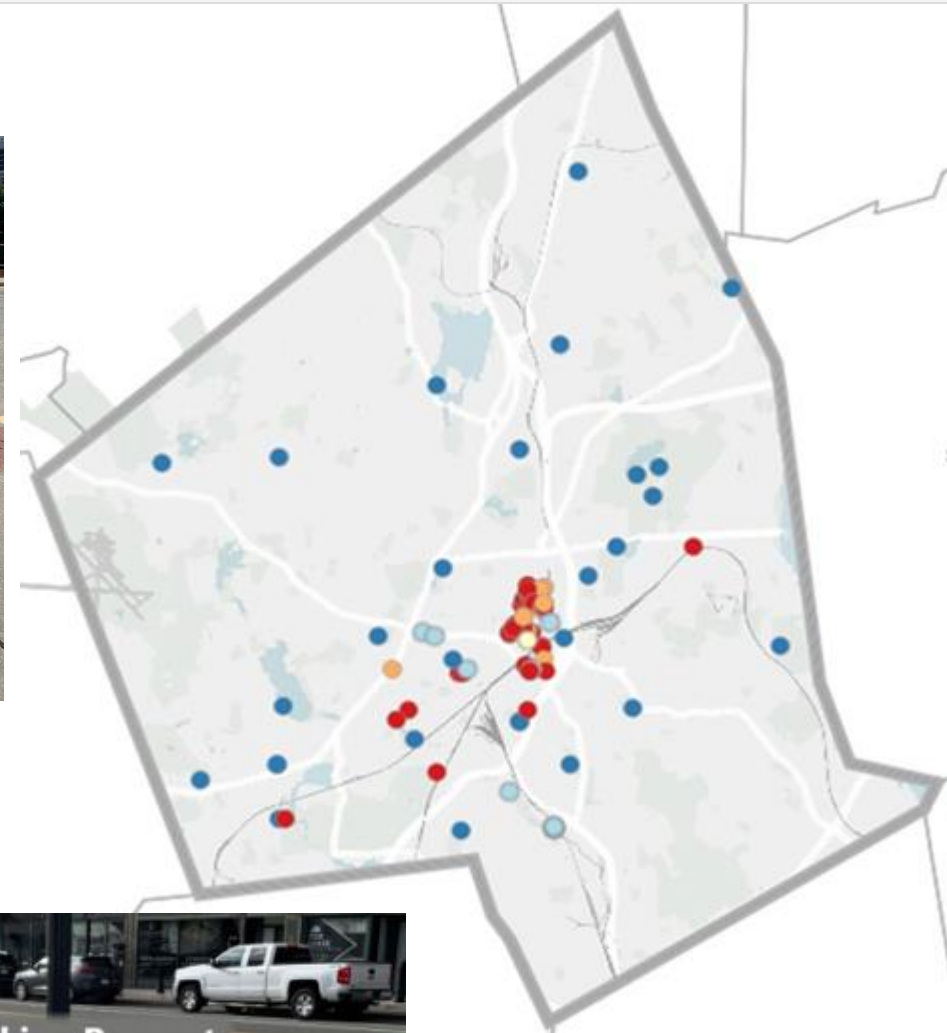
Bike / Micromobility

- Bike Lanes
 - Added 13.5 miles of bike lanes,
 - Grove Street
 - Burncoat Street
 - Stafford Street
- Bike Boxes
 - Grove Street and Forest Street
- Painted Bicycle Crossings
 - Stafford Street
 - Main Street
 - Grove Street
 - Mill Street
 - Burncoat Street
 - McKeon Road
- Social media educational campaign

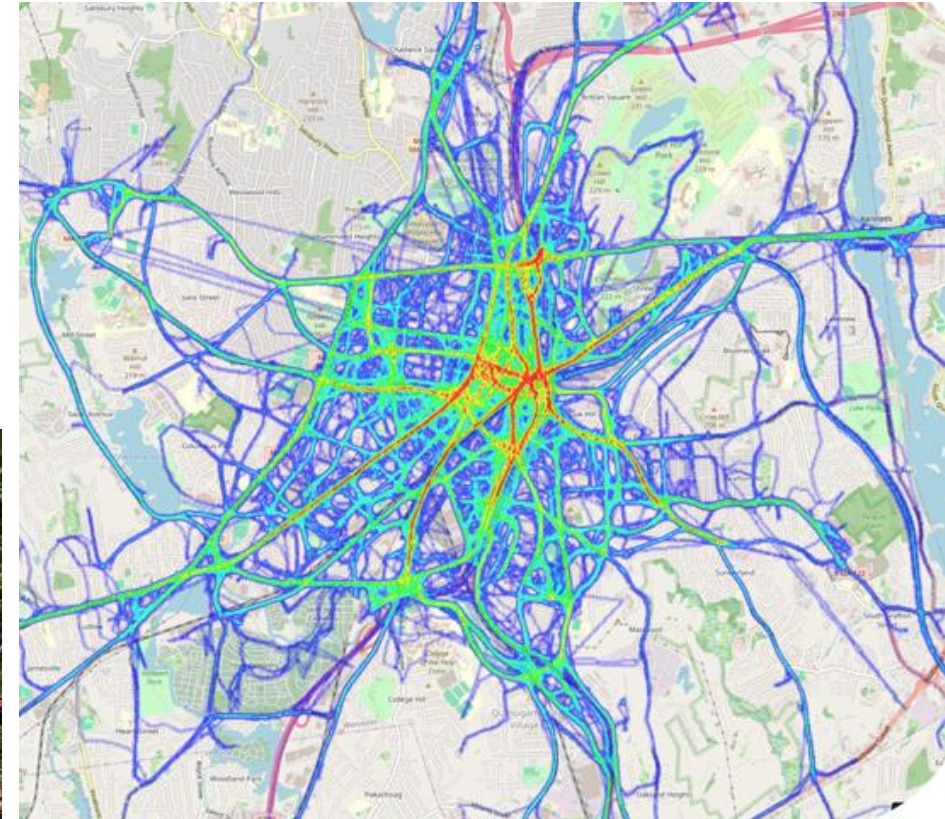


- Bike Racks

- Created GIS inventory of publicly-available bike racks
- Posted and interactive webmap of bike rack locations
- Created an online request form for bike rack locations
- Published guidelines for bike racks in the public right-of-way covering rack types, spacing and location, and best practices for bike racks on private property
- Installed 96 new bike racks.



- E-Bike Share pilot
 - Funded by a grant from the Massachusetts Clean Energy Center Accelerating Clean Energy for All (ACT4All) program
 - Metro Mobility is a Cambridge, MA-based bike share operator with locations in the Boston area, Lawrence, Lowell, and Quincy
 - Available to rent for \$1/per day for income-eligible riders
 - Each e-bike is GPS-enabled, allowing us to better understand travel patterns



- Improved real-time transit information
- Record ridership over 5 million passenger trips in FY2025.
- Continuing fare free transit
- Initiated a bus stop inventory and rebalancing study. Bus stop shelter and amenities guidelines are in development
- Implemented a phase 1 of schedule changes and initiated a full analysis to improve headways and hours of service



Incorporate Green Infrastructure in Roadway Projects

- Partnered with the Department of Sustainability and Resilience to convert a portion of the McGrath municipal parking lot into the City's first Miyawaki Forest.
